Dear sir I have your esteemed favor of the 10th and am inclosing copy of letter to Mr Robert H, Taft.

you doubtless are aware that I can not stay out of the mill buisness, as you know I sold my 25 Bbl mill with a view to quitting, but the old lore was too much for me, so I bought back the "Baby" Midget I sold Mr, Phipps, and am in it again endeavoring to do my "Bit" in helping give the people a bread fit to eat, i, e; "american Marval" FLOUR. and as you remember the flour hopper under this mill is "12 To 14" shorter than the mill frame and fails there-fore to receive the flour from the tale of the last reduction reel, hence with this arrangement we must have a second grade flour, or have considerable difficulty in getting it to the elevator leg, when as I have unfortunately and unthoughtedly, placed the elevators at the side of the mill.

Now if you can give me the LONG hopper like the arrangement of the 25Bbl, mill I can then make the straight grade easy enough with the use of the 19" wheel you spoke of in your letter.

so you may send me at once the 19" wheel for the 1st, Reduction conveyor: and if in your judgement it will work out satisfactory; you may send the LONG flour hopper. I could return the one I now have and you mite use it in another, at any rate, the heads and bearings, would be serviceable.

hoping to hear from you soon, and thanking you for the interest manifested in my beaing able to meet the food administrations requirements;

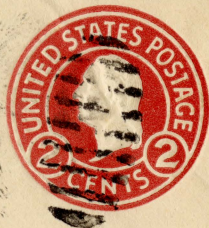
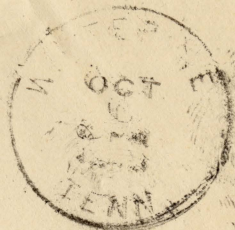
and boots to match and felting
