The chancel was banked with palms and ferns, forming a background for two floor baskets of Easter lilies. Back of the altar were placed candelabras containing burning white tapers.

The beautiful and impressive ceremony was read by the Reverend Thomas E. Dudney of Kingsport, assisted by Dr. C. K. Wingo of the Munsey Memorial M. E. Church, South.

Preceding the ceremony the following musical selections were offered: "Love Dream," (Lizst) by Mrs. Henry I. Burbage and vocal numbers, "Bridal Dawn," (Martin) and "A Bridal Song," (Ward) by Miss Lillian Rhea Hunter. "The Bridal Chorus" from Lohengrin (Wagner) and Mendelssohn's "Wedding March," were played.

The bride was given in marriage by her brother, Mr. Robert N. Dosser, and her only attendant was her sister, Mrs. Oran P. Ward, of Charlotte, N. C. Mr. Edwin J. Wagner served the groom as best man.

The bride was lovely in a becoming frock of Aloma crepe, fashioned princess style and her hat, a small imported model, was of purple felt. She carried an arm bouquet of orchids, valley lilies and roses.

The dame of honor wore a fashionable costume of green crepe with shoulder corsage of lavender sweet-peas and roses.

Only the immediate relatives witnessed the ceremony. From out of the city were, Mr. and Mrs. Frank F. Dosser and Mrs. James H. Dosser of Morristown, and Mrs. Nelle Fain Clement of Bristol.
