for May 25 A big religious festival is to be conducted in Hudson on Sunday, May 25, by the Royal Michaelense Autonomic Benefit association, under

direction of Manuel J. Pimental Jr.,

really have a beginning on the night before, with a band concert, to be given on the Davis lot, at Main and

Manning streets, for which permission has already been obtained from the selectmen. St. Michael's church is to be open for those who desire to visit and worship there.

On Sunday, representatives of the order will come from many places, and a street parade, mass, sacred procession, banquet and speaking will feature the day. The mass will be celebrated by a visiting Portugese

priest. Already lodges in Cambridge, East Boston, Somerville, Lawrence and Lowell have notified the Hudson lodge that they will participate in

the parade and exercises following it. It is expected that at least five bands will be in line, presence of the Hud-son band, Cambridge Liberty band and Lawrence Harmony band being assured. It is planned to start the parade as

near nine o'clock as possible, and the line will pass over every principal street in town, ending at St. Michael's church, where there is to be a special mass and sermon at 10,30. After the church service there will be a procession from Wood square to

the Fitchburg station, in which the Saint of the order will be carried. Dinner is to be served afterwards, possibly in the state armory. A number of noted Portugese are to be

invited.
