CONGREGATIONAL MEETING.

The regular annual congregational meeting for the transacting of business was held on Wednesday evening, October 28, at 7:30, the order of business was as follows:

Hymn No. 457; Scripture reading, 7th chapter Ezra; prayer; hymn No. 284; reading of the minutes of the March meeting; reports of officers, Financial Secretary Leachey and Treasurer Sener; remarks on the reports by J. W. Reith; report from the Church Council recommending the nomination of Messrs. Nolty and Leachey for Elders, and Sweger and Dietrich for Deacons. The report was accepted and the following gentlemen were also placed in nomina-

tion, J. C. Schutte for Elder, and Frederick A. Slaugh, Wm. L. Rineer, Fred. Ernest and Wm. Z. Roy for Deacons.

The pastor briefly reviewed the work of the different church societies. Mr. Leachey favored the annual publication of a year book; the matter was discussed by a few, but a vote was not asked. Garfield Rineer and Wm. Hawman were appointed tellers for the annual election. The meeting adjourned by singing hymn No. 273, the Doxology, the Lord's Prayer and the Benediction.

The report of the Treasurer of the Building Committee was only an approximate one, and will not be published, but as soon as the building is completed and a correct account is rendered, the same will be published.
