Ellen Sutnam was asked to be chairman of the housekeeping committee. It was decided to have a meeting every month while it seems necessary. There was a discussion concerning the repair or replacement of the shades in the boys lovatory. It was decided that the window curtains should be vashedand mrs. Sonner offered to take them down and rehang them. Mrs. B sed will wash them and mrs. Lamb will iron them.

mrs. Turner gave a report on information obtained concerning hot lunches. She reported that help is provided for an a lunch only. She reported further that we might get hot lunches from Hensington if they approve, but mis. Johnson inquired and found that Hensington does not have adequate equipment to furnish hot lunches to Havett Barb.

It was decided that hot lunches could not be served this winter. We are to apply in may for hot lunches next year.

It was suggested that the housebeeping chairman have cleaning of the bitchen attended to even though we will not use

it this year. Mrs. Oney reported that \$1950 worth of victory bonds were sold. Aur quota was \$500. It was decided to have the Christmas program in the afternoon.
