Minutes for Chapel Guild.

April - 1942.

The April meeting of the Chapel Guild was held at the home of Mrs. Ingeberg on Apr. 9, 1942, with Mrs. Haile Chisholm assisting hostess.

After a delightful luncheon, the meeting was called to order by the president. The minutes were read and approved. The treas. reported a balance of \$173<sup>58</sup>. She also reported an anonymous donation of nine cents to make our organ fund a fine \$100<sup>00</sup>. The secretary was paid \$1<sup>01</sup> for postal cards used for monthly notices.

Mrs. Darling reported that she stayed well within her budget for housecleaning the chapel at Easter.

Mrs. Krizer asked to be removed from the visiting committee and asked that she be given no committee work for the following year.

The president announced that the nominating committee had proposed a slate comprising the following officers:

Mrs. Ina Akers, V. Pres.

Mrs. Ingeberg, Treas.

Mrs. Kizer, Sec.

There were no nominations from the floor so a motion was made and carried to accept the nominations made by the committee.

Miss Rucker reported that the flag situation is rather acute. It was estimated that two flags (Church and National) would cost about \$45<sup>00</sup>. A motion was made to authorize Miss Rucker to purchase a national flag for the Chapel.

Everyone was requested to pay all dues.

The meeting adjourned.

The treas. reported a balance of \$172<sup>53</sup>.

It was moved and carried to pay Mr. Dove 50 cents an hour - \$1<sup>25</sup> for the job of cutting chapel lawn.

Mr. Safford said there would be informal services in the morning following the closing of Sunday school.

The meeting adjourned.

June. 1942

The Chapel Guild met at the home of Mrs. Charles Norton on Monday, June 8. with Mrs. Coelius and Mrs. Ina Akers as assistant hostesses. Thirteen members were present.

Mrs. Mae Mully reported that the Ways and Means Comm. had not been able to have a meeting.

Mrs. Darling reported on the work done in the Chapel.

The visiting Comm. had made several calls.

As there was no new business, the meeting adjourned for the summer.

Oct. 12, 1942

The Oct. meeting of the Chapel Guild was held at the home of Miss Ruth Rucker with Mrs. Richard Akers as assistant hostess. Ten members and one visitor were present.

The treas. reported a balance of \$154.11.

Mrs. Defendorf gave an interesting report of the work done by the Grounds Comm. She reported a deficit of .75. The treas. was instructed to give this amount to Mrs. Dye.

Mrs. Weaver reported that the supply of communion wine, wafers and candles was low. It was suggested that ordinary bread be used for the communion.

Mrs. Chisholm said that the Chapel windows would be washed after Halloween!

Mrs. Weaver suggested that each member of the Guild call on three new families in the Park. The Visiting Committee agreed to make a list

of the new families.

Mr. Safford asked that a list of the Garrett Park boys now in Service be posted at the Chapel. He also asked that the hour of service on the bulletin board be corrected.

It was moved and ~~seconded~~ <sup>carried</sup> that the Guild give five dollars to the Episcopal, Eye, Ear and Throat hospital. The meeting adjourned.

The treas. reported a balance of \$57<sup>16</sup>.

The Visiting Comm. reported calls made to the new residents and asked those who were not able to visit their list of names to do so by the next meeting.

A notice of the Thanksgiving service in the Park was to be posted at the Post Office.

The meeting adjourned.



Dec. 1942

The altar committee, as usual, to get appropriate flowers for the Christmas services.

A motion was made the Guild donate \$50. to Grace House.

It was moved and carried to give Mrs. Bisset a reading table, (cost \$3.95) and Mrs. Weaver gave a book for Mrs. Bisset on the occasion of their 50th wedding anniversary.

investigate the price of white material  
for hangings.

It was suggested wire screening be  
used on back of pews to keep out  
mice.

Mrs. Payne was received as a new  
member.

The Guild asked the secretary to  
write a letter of thank to Mrs. Brown  
for polishing the brass.

The meeting adjourned.

March. 1943.

The Chapel Guild met in March (2) with Mrs. Alford and Mrs. Weaver as hostesses. Thirteen members were present.

The Treas. reported a balance of \$35<sup>02</sup>. A suggestion was made the organ money could be put into War Bonds.

The Pres. asked the secretary to write Mr. Dove a note of thanks for his work.

The Guild voted to donate \$5<sup>00</sup> to the Red Cross War Fund. Mrs. Weaver is Publicity Chairman for Montgomery County.

The Altar Committee reported the white hangings may be relined in order to have them hang straight. The decision was left with the committee.

Mrs. Hill will write the names of our boys in service on a scroll to be put in the Chapel.

The meeting closed with a prayer for our boys and for World Peace.

April 9. 1943

The April meeting of the Chapel Guild was held at the home of Mrs. Hizer with Mrs. Stevens assisting.

The Treas. reported a balance of 130.57.

Mrs. Weaver, Altar Committee Chairman, reported that she would like to shop a little more for ribbons. Miss Lucy Mackrell, 11 West Kirk St, Chevy Chase, Md. was suggested as a likely place for such a purchase.

Mrs. Marton wanted to furnish the altar flowers for Easter in memory of her husband, Mr. Ches. Marton. Mrs. Brown was asked to buy two palms for use on Palm Sunday.

Our Chapel roof, having been noticed to assume an angelic mein and take wing occasionally, ~~there~~ was needed some discussion as to proper shingling. It was also suggested that we approach Freshy and Sharpe and see if we can get priority on hinges for our shutters.

Mr. Safford was able to purchase quite a nice honor roll scroll for our boys in the service.

It was moved, seconded and carried that the dues be raised to \$2.00 per year.

It was also moved, seconded and carried that the proposed budget be accepted.

The raising of extra money was left until after Christmas.

Mrs. Weaver, Chairman of Allan Com. reported that Mr. Weaver had purchased communion wine at an expense of \$1.41. It was moved that the Treasurer reimburse him in



this amount.

Mrs. Haile Christolm, Housekeeping Committee Chairman, reported Mr. Dove was in need of a new broom and some floor oil, and she was authorized to purchase the same.

Our president, Miss Rucker, announced that there were eight more names to be added to Honor Roll.

Mr. Safford suggested having a flower calendar; that one used at Kensington was very successful. He also wished there were some way to increase the Chapel attendance.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned - after prayer by our Rector.
