Mrs. Raper announced definite plans for the reception for Mr and Mrs. Cutt. After naming her chairman of the various committees, each one reported in turn.

The remaining time was spent in formulating plans for a Mexican Street Fair. Mrs. MacMillan, the chairman announced her plans and committee heads and a discussion of details followed.

The Guild met in the Chapel on June 14th, at one o'clock, for the last meeting before adjourning for the summer, with Mrs. Longberg and Mrs. Darling hostesses.

The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. MacMillan reported on the Mexican Street Fair and thanked everyone for their splendid cooperation.

Mrs. Raper reported on the cost of the party and gift for Mr and Mrs. Cutt.

A balance of \$79.24 was reported by the Treasurer.

Mrs. MacMillan asked every lady to take another baby garment in addition to any unfinished ones on hand as so few have been sent to the Mission.

New Paper-Plates were distributed as a means of raising money for the Guild again this year. They will be due on Mother's Day next spring.

A motion was made to appropriate twelve dollars to be used at Mrs. Dye's discretion in moving the shrubbery at the Chapel.

A discussion of new projects and interests was presented by the President, the first being the necessity of extending the Guild Membership and enlarging church attendance. Each member was urged to call on at least

two newcomers during the summer. The necessity of repairing and re-decorating the chapel was met with a motion to give a minimum of \$50 to help with this work. Ways and means of making money were discussed. Mrs. Weaver suggested several "gamble" ways offered by the Bond Bakery and Gen. Electric Company.

A motion was carried to postpone until September the decision on the advisability of giving a Turkey Dinner in the fall.

Mrs. Brown suggested the novel idea of having an herb garden and offered to root some plants for sale. These and other plants and unusual jellies, etc. could be offered for sale at the proposed Turkey Dinner. A garden club was mentioned in connection with this work.

Mrs. Darling stated the communion wine had been arranged for by Mr. Butt and presented to the chapel as a gift.

Sept 13th, 1937

The Guild convened on Sept 13th in the Chapel, with Mrs. Weaver and Mrs. Defendorf as hostesses.

The meeting was opened with a prayer and address by Mrs. Safford, our new Rector.

The reading and approval of the Secretary's minutes were followed by committee reports.

In the absence of Mrs. Brown, Mrs. Defendorf presented her report on the herb garden project. Pursuant to Mrs. Brown's request, Mrs. Weaver will appoint a committee to price the potted plants. The Guild authorized Mrs. Brown to purchase the necessary pots at her own discretion and she will be reimbursed.

It was suggested paper-pots could be used for transplanting to the garden.

Mrs. Mac Millan reported on the number of baby garments for the Mission and the amount of material on hand and urged the members to finish all outstanding garments by next meeting.

In this connection, Mrs. Beck explained that the Mission was Grace House on the Mountain and emphasized their great need. She was asked to find out if the women could sew and mend, so we could send used garments and materials by the yard.

It was suggested that the care of the shrubbery during the painting of the Chapel be called to Mrs. Deje's attention.

Mrs. Thomas reported on Housekeeping. The splendid work of Barbara Wells and Laura Darling in cleaning the small Sunday-School room was commended.

A balance of \$15.11 was reported by the Treasurer.

Mrs. Richard Akers was requested to give a report for her husband about the progress made by the Chapel Committee in repairing the Chapel. She reported the roof had been repaired, new cords and locks had been placed on some of the windows, a short new stove-pipe replaced the old unsightly one and the outside of the Chapel was being painted. As the repairs total \$350 and there is a shortage in the Treasury, Mr. Akers offered to use his influence with the County in equipping the Garrett Park School kitchen for the use of the Guild if they will contribute some money. The Guild sponsored a Turkey Dinner to be given between Oct 1st and Thanksgiving under the Chairmanship of Mrs. Thomas, Mrs. Raper and Mrs. Chisholm assisting - and agreed to help the men with the Chapel repairs if they in turn will equip the School kitchen and assist the Guild in re-decorating the interior of the Chapel.

The Chapel Guild met at the home of Mrs. McMullan with Mrs. Truitt as the assistant hostess on Oct. 11. ¹⁸ Sixteen members and two visitors were present. After luncheon the business meeting was held with the vice-president, Mrs. Beck, in the chair, owing to the absence of the president, Mrs. Weaver. After prayer by the rector, Mr. Safford, the minutes of the previous meeting were read by Mrs. Lundy acting secretary for the day. ^{Minutes approved as read.} The treasurer's report was then made showing a balance of \$9.43.

Mrs. Richard Akers reported that the proposed Southern Dairies party could be held on Dec. 2 but since that date would coincide with the Civic Study Club meeting it was decided to postpone the party until the first of the year.

Mrs. Raper read a letter from the B.M. Chandler Co. regarding labels - a sample pack of which was shown. It was decided to send in an order for the names already in and then to solicit for another order. Miss Renshaw was appointed to take charge of this matter.
