The third meeting of the
Mothers Club of Garrett Park
School was held April 19, 1944
at the school house with Mrs Buck,
President, presiding.

In the absence of the Treasurer
Mrs Kiser, Mrs Buck read the
treasurer's report as follows:
Balance in Treasury \$2.45, \$34.20 of which
is a special fund. (Verify)

There was a discussion concerning
disposition of check for \$9.80 received
from paper salvage. Agreed it was
property of the school children and
to be spent as they wish. Check has
been turned over to Mrs Dewey.

There was a discussion concerning
the need for a new flag and rope.
The report on the 4th War Loan was

That Garrett Park school had exceeded their quota five times, selling 1600 in War bonds and stamps.

Following discussion it was requested that the Secretary write a letter to the Town Council recommending a bulletin board to be erected at the Post Office to facilitate the work of the Mothers Club.

The Secretary was requested to write Mrs Ingey a thank you note for her services as nurse in examining the children for Scarlet fever.

The President read a letter of thanks from the Representative of the Red Cross for U. S. S. R for the Russian War Relief Kits which the organization filled.

There was a discussion concerning another paper drive.

The summer recreation program was discussed. There was nothing official to report at this time. The summer library program was discussed and Mrs Turner appointed to investigate the possibilities of a loan of books.

There was a discussion of an evening program for Fallers and the planning of a May Festival.

There was a discussion of school gardens. The fund for plowing (\$5) is to be paid by the Mothers Club. Each child is to have a plot 10 X 15 and furnish his own seeds.

There was a discussion concerning playground equipment that is needed.

Mrs Turner was appointed to study what is available. There is money in the special fund for playground equipment, the expenditure of which is subject to the approval of the school trustees.

Mrs Putnam was named chairman of the nominating committee, Mrs Johnson to serve with her. Meeting adjourned.

(1) During the month the Secy wrote a letter to the Silver Springs Fire Dept requesting them to use their equipment to install our new flag & rope furnished by the County Board.

(2) Letter to County Board of education requesting \$10 for books.

(3) Letter to Town Council re Bulletin Board to Mrs Ingles.

The fourth and last meeting of the year of the Garrett Park Mollers Club was held at the school May 10, 1944; Mrs Buck, President presiding. Minutes were read by Mrs Putnam in absence of the secretary, and approved.

Mrs Buck opened discussion concerning equipment for the school. No decision was reached.

Mrs Turner made a motion that the money available for books (\$25 + \$10) be turned over to Mrs Ducey for books. There was discussion concerning the State Library Committee sponsoring books for lending library. Also that the Citizens Association will sponsor such a project. Newspaper collection should not

cease through the summer,

It was requested that the Secretary write a letter to Mrs Scott thanking her for her efforts in mending library books and donating materials.

It was announced that the summer recreation program would begin June 28th with a full program of varied activities
