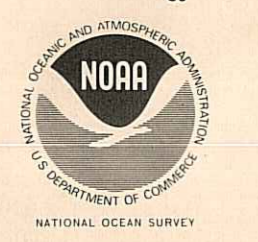


NEW CHART NUMBERING SYSTEM
 The National Ocean Survey, in cooperation with the Defense Mapping Agency Hydrographic Center, is in the process of adopting a new chart numbering system. The new system is based on the numbers of the National Ocean Survey and Defense Mapping Agency charts. The new chart numbers are listed in the following table:
