and all such other persons as may from time to time be associated with them and their successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate and politic in the city of Washington, in the District of Columbia, by the name of "The Congressional Club." And by that name they and their successors may have perpetual succession, may use a common seal, and alter the same at pleasure, and elect officers and agents, and may take, receive, hold and convey real and personal estate necessary for the purposes of the association.

Section 2. That the object of the club is to promote acquaintance-ship among its members, to facilitate their social intercourse, and to provide a place of meeting which may help to secure for them the advantages of life in the national capital. And, in pursuance of said object, it may have a constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations to carry out the same, and shall have power to change and amend its constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations at pleasure; *Provided*, That such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations or amendments thereof, do not conflict with the laws of the United States or of any State.

Section 3. That Congress reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal this Act.

## Constitution

#### ARTICLE I

#### NAME

The name of this association shall be "The Congres-SIONAL CLUB."

#### ARTICLE II

### OBJECT

The object of this club is to promote acquaintanceship among its members, to facilitate their social intercourse and to provide a place of meeting which may help to secure for them the advantages of life in the National Capital, in pursuance whereof the club was incorporated by Act of Congress, approved May 30, 1908.

### ARTICLE III

#### MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The active membership shall be composed of the wives of Senators and Representatives in Congress. The mother, daughter or sister of a Senator or Representative in Congress, presiding over his household at Washington, shall also be eligible to active membership.

SEC. 2. The wife or widow of an ex-Member of Congress, who was such Member's wife while he was in

Congress, and who still bears his name, is eligible to active membership.

- SEC. 3. The wives of the Justices of the Supreme Court and of the several Members of the Cabinet, may become active members.
- SEC. 4. The associate membership of the club shall be composed of the daughters residing in the household at Washington, of a Senator or Representative in Congress.
- SEC. 5. The wife of the President of the United States and the wife of the Vice-President of the United States shall be invited to become honorary members of the club.
- SEC. 6. Any one eligible to membership may, upon the payment of five hundred dollars (\$500.00), and only upon such payment, become a life member, and thereafter be exempt from all dues of the club. The revenue so obtained shall constitute a fund to be used only for the rental and maintenance or the purchasing of a clubhouse suitable for the needs of the club.

### ARTICLE IV

#### **OFFICERS**

Section 1. The officers of this organization shall be a President, five Vice-Presidents, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer, to be elected by ballot by the members of the organization at the regular meeting in February of the second regular session of Congress, and the term of office shall commence at the meeting following elections and continue for the succeeding term of Congress.

SEC. 2. No officer shall be eligible for re-election until after a lapse of two years.

#### ARTICLE V

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- SECTION 1. It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all of the regular and special meetings of the organization and to perform such other duties as may devolve upon the office.
- SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Presidents, in their order named, to preside.
- SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of the Recording Secretary to keep an accurate record of all meetings, regular or special; and to perform such other duties as may be incumbent upon that office.
- SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the Corresponding Secretary to attend to the correspondence of the organization, and to see that proper notices of all regular and special meetings and entertainments of the club are issued.
- SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep a true and accurate account of all moneys coming into her hands; to deliver to the chairman of the House Committee at stated times such sum or sums of money as may be directed by the Executive Board; and to make an itemized report at each monthly meeting of the organization and a summary thereof at the annual meeting in February.

### ARTICLE VI

#### COMMITTEES

Section 1. There shall be an Executive Committee which shall be composed of the officers of the organization; and the following committees shall be appointed by the President:

An Advisory Committee, which shall be composed of one member from each State represented in the membership of the organization, of which committee the President shall be chairman.

A Membership Committee, which shall consist of five members.

An Entertainment Committee, which shall consist of five members.

A House Committee, which shall consist of five members.

A Finance Committee, which shall consist of five members.

A Press and Printing Committee, which shall consist of three members.

A Book Committee, which shall consist of three members.

SEC. 2. Special Committees may be appointed by the President, as occasion demands.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### AMENDMENTS

Section 1. All proposed amendments to this Constitution shall be submitted in writing at the regular meeting of this organization in December, laid on the table until the next regular meeting, and then voted upon.

SEC. 2. A two-thirds vote of the members present at such meeting shall be necessary to adopt the amendment.

# By-Laws

#### ARTICLE I

#### MEETINGS

- Section 1. This organization shall hold its regular meetings on the first Wednesday of each month until June first, during the sessions of Congress.
- SEC. 2. Special meetings of the organization may be called by the President upon written notice to the members.
- SEC. 3. At the request of ten members of the organization the President shall call a special meeting for the consideration of such business as may be specified in the call.
- SEC. 4. Twenty-five members of this organization shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- SEC. 5. Five members of the Advisory Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

### ARTICLE II

#### INITIATION FEES AND DUES

SECTION 1. Each active member of this organization shall pay the initiation fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) upon becoming a member.

- SEC. 2. Annual dues shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), payable before the date of the regular meeting in December of each year.
- SEC. 3. If dues are unpaid on February first of each year, the delinquents shall cease to be members of the club.

- SEC. 4. The annual dues of non-resident members shall be five dollars (\$5.00), payable on or before December first of each year. Only active members shall be eligible to non-resident membership.
- SEC. 5. Active members leaving Washington permanently or absent from the city for the entire session of Congress, may, upon written application to the Treasurer, be placed upon the non-resident list of members. Upon return to the city as a resident, a member on the non-resident list becomes responsible for the full amount of the annual dues of an active member.
- SEC. 6. Members having severed their connection with the club for any reason whatsoever may become members again only upon the same conditions as new members.
- SEC. 7. The annual dues of an associate member shall be five dollars (\$5.00). To be eligible to associate membership a daughter of an active member of the club must be at least in her eighteenth year.

Other members of the immediate family, resident in the household of an active member of the club, may obtain guest privileges for the season upon the payment of five dollars (\$5.00). A non-transferable guest card for the season shall be issued in such cases. Principals' dues must be paid each year before dues of associate members, or before payment for yearly guest card can be accepted.

- SEC. 8. Only those members paying the regular initiation fee and annual dues of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be eligible to vote or be permitted to wear the club pin.
- SEC. 9. Those in the families of new Members of Congress entitled to membership in the club shall be admitted into the club during any special session of Congress that

precedes the first regular session of that Congress by payment of the initiation fee only and regular annual dues in the December following.

#### ARTICLE III

#### ELECTIONS

- Section 1. At a called meeting two weeks before the regular election, an informal ballot shall be cast to select candidates for each office. The two names receiving the greatest number of votes shall be considered the nominees. In case of the resignation of one or more nominees for any office, nominations to fill such vacancy may be made from the floor on the day of election.
- SEC. 2. At the January meeting previous to the election a committee of five to take charge of elections shall be nominated from the floor and elected.
- SEC. 3. At the January meeting previous to the election of officers there shall also be five (5) alternates nominated and elected, who will act in the event that vacancies occur on the Elections Committee, to serve in the order of their election.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

- Section 1. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to exercise a general supervision over the affairs of the organization.
- SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the Advisory Committee to aid and advise the Executive Committee concerning all matters relating to the welfare of the organization and the

promotion of its aims and objects; and to take a special interest in the State delegation in which the member belongs.

- SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of the Membership Committee to receive applications for admission to the club; and, with the approval of the Executive Committee, determine the eligibility of each applicant; and notify the Treasurer of all persons admitted to membership.
- SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the Entertainment Committee to provide and manage all entertainments which may be given by the organization.
- SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the House Committee to take charge of the clubhouse or meeting place of the organization, the furniture and fixtures thereof, and prescribe rules and regulations for the conduct of the members while in or about the club or meeting place of the organization. Said House Committee, when authorized by the Executive Board, shall purchase all furniture and permanent fixtures for the use of the club. Said House Committee shall employ all servants necessary in its management; pay for the same out of any funds placed in its hands by the Treasurer; and said House Committee shall make a report of its receipts and disbursements to the club at each monthly meeting thereof.
- SEC. 6. It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to approve all bills and audit the accounts of the Treasurer twice annually.
- SEC. 7. It shall be the duty of the Press and Printing Committee to see that suitable publicity of entertainments be given; and to attend to all engraving and printing required by the club.

- SEC. 8. It shall be the duty of the Book Committee to take charge of the Library of the club, keep account of the volumes, and to purchase suitable periodicals and papers.
- SEC. 9. Special Committees shall perform such duties as may devolve upon them.

#### ARTICLE V

#### **EXPENSES**

All expenses for entertainments given under the auspices of this organization shall be paid out of the general fund of the organization, provided that at no time shall an appropriation be made that will leave a balance of less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) in the treasury.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### USE OF THE CLUBHOUSE

The clubhouse may be had by any member for entertaining on any day that does not conflict with the plans of the House Committee, by paying all expenses pertaining thereto.

When so used by any member in the evening, the sum of ten dollars additional shall be paid for such use.

Application for such use must be made to the chairman of the House Committee.

### ARTICLE VII

#### TEA

- SECTION 1. Tea will be served to any member of the club and her friends at any reasonable time at fifteen cents (15 cents) for each person.
  - SEC. 2. No gratuities allowed to servants.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### RECEPTION DAY

- Section 1. Friday will be reception day, when some distinguished person will be the guest of honor, or some entertainment will be provided.
- Sec. 2. A member may have as a guest on Friday a resident of the city, provided said person has not already been a guest of the club during the season, by presentation of a guest card, which shall be obtained upon application to the social secretary.
- SEC. 3. Members may invite their non-resident guests to any entertainment of the club, provided the visiting card of the member, with the name of her guest and her State written thereon be presented at the door, unless otherwise ordered by the Executive Board.
- Sec. 4. Members must present membership cards on Friday or any day when an entertainment is given.
- SEC. 5. Non-members who are eligible may not be guests of members of the club

### ARTICLE IX

#### PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

### ARTICLE X

#### AMENDMENTS

Section 1. All proposed amendments to the By-Laws shall be submitted in writing at a regular meeting of the organization, and shall be voted upon at the next regular meeting.

Sec. 2. A majority of the votes cast shall be necessary

to adopt such amendment.

Sec. 3. Any By-Law may be suspended for that meeting by a unanimous vote of the members present at any regular meeting of the club.

# Standing Rules

Any member having complaints or suggestions to make as to the management of the clubhouse must do so in writing to the House Committee.

No member shall take any property whatever belonging to the clubhouse from the clubhouse except on the authority of a resolution of the Board of Directors.

Under no circumstances shall a member send club servants out of the clubhouse.

No member shall reprove a servant. Complaint must be made to the House Committee.

No fee or gratuity may be given to any servant of the club.

Any extra servants necessary for entertainments must be engaged by the House Committee.

Members may bring their school girl daughters under eighteen years of age, on Friday afternoons, without payment of dues.

Associate members are privileged to invite an escort for dances given by the club.

No advertisement may come before the club in any form. Notices of general interest to the club may be posted by permission of the Executive Board.

Persons staying in Washington more than one month are considered as residents, either temporary or permanent.
