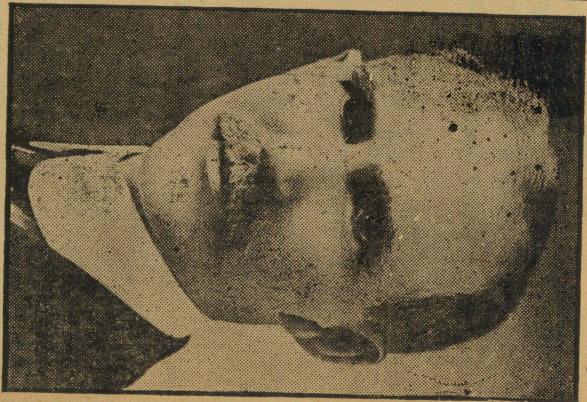

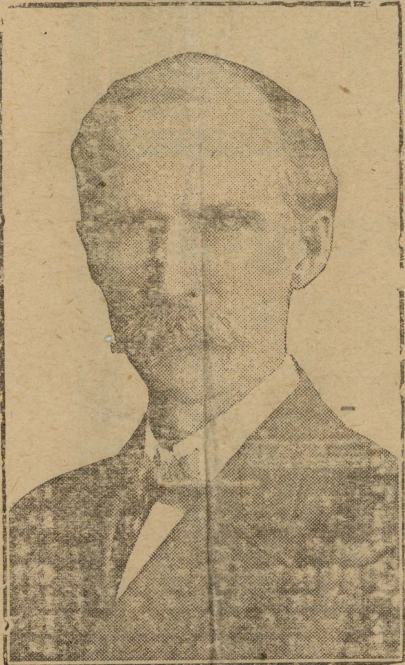

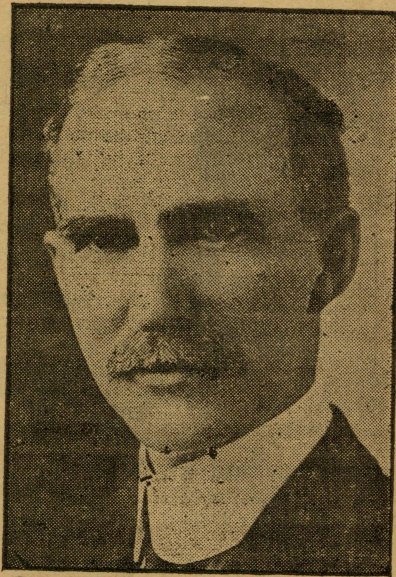
Dick T. Morgan is a candidate for re-nomination and election for congressman in this, the 8th district.

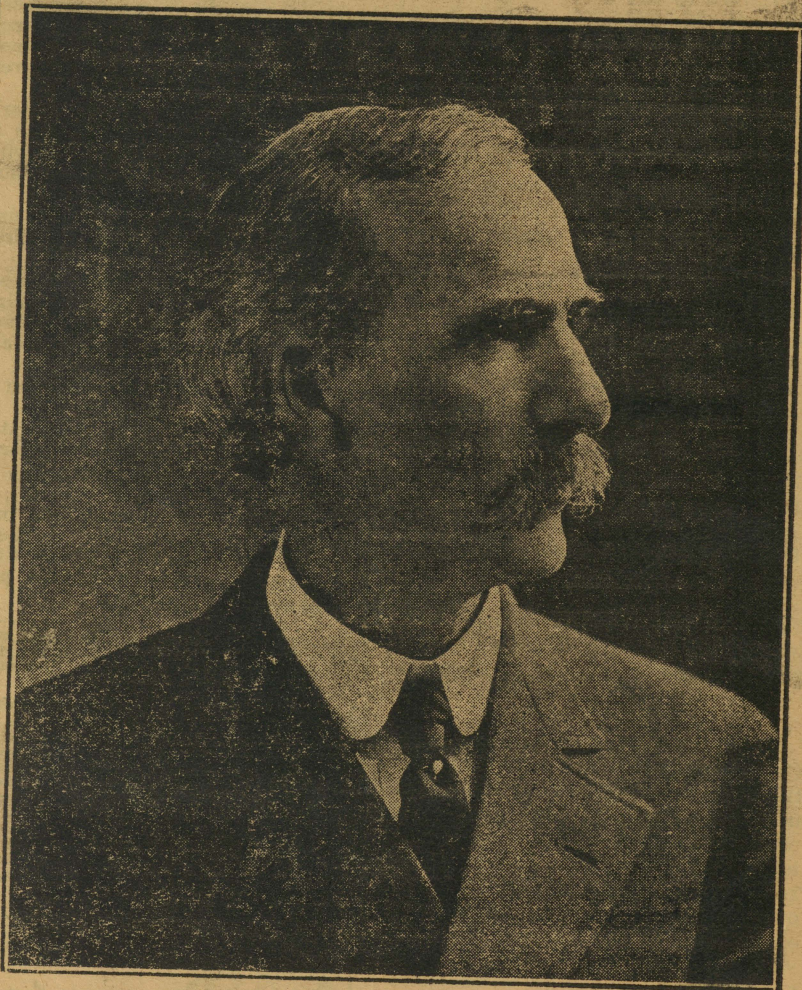

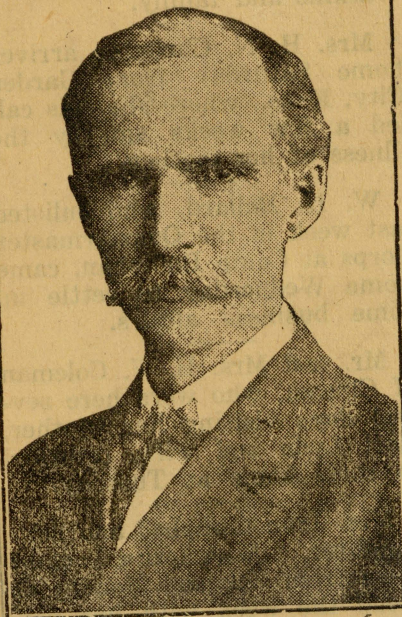
