I am writing you as the Commander of the ~~American~~ ~~Legion~~ local organization of the American Legion, and the representative of the ex-service men in your community.

I merely desire to call your attention to the fact that if any soldier in the community has failed to receive or obtain his additional travel pay, his bonus of sixty dollars, his uniform and equipment allowed by the Government, or the Victory button issued to all honorably discharged soldiers, I shall be glad to extend all possible aid in ~~xxx~~ securing any of these items, and to give information and assistance as to government insurance.

If the father, mother or dependent of any soldier has failed to receive his or her allotment or government allowance, and will advise me fully of the facts, I shall be more than glad to assist in securing the amount due.
