Garden City, Kansas May 20, 1889

Dear Husband:

To try and write through this day I'm afraid is a poor hive for either of us. If there was any late important news, we'd better make a R.S. of it and do our main writing we's, hadn't we? R. objected to me writing on his sheet so I later this. I must lay only a word now, as I must get up this ever. I didn't get your Sunday letter written yesterday but will by and get it off soon. I didn't get to church today. Seems so hard without you. I was a lonely girl yesterday again, without you. I am hurried too, like you-trying to get everything done.

I see your Guthrie papers, many thanks. The Morgan puff sounded well- did you pay? Salt Celler came this morning Hurrah!

Hope we will be able to use it aright. Mr. Carter brought 'C' last Tuesday down and she paged me that. So I have plenty money get. I think I'll [underlined] get [/underlined] your pillow-case off tomorrow- let me know when you get it. I send your papers to-day- Call for your papers.
