under three heads. First, the preparation before beginning teaching; second, the ~~continuous or daily~~ ^{while engaged in teaching} preparation; Third, heart preparation. The preliminary preparation should be broad, thorough and comprehensive. The teacher should know what to teach and how to teach it. There should be no inclination to limit the ~~pre~~ ^{pre}liminary education to the study of the branches which ^{one} expects to teach. Teachers, be bold mariners, on the great ocean of knowledge. Sail out, far beyond the point to which you expect to pilot your pupils.

Second, the work of preparation never ceases. Constant, continuous, persistent preparation is indispensable to meritorious & effective work. The highest success will come only from daily preparation.

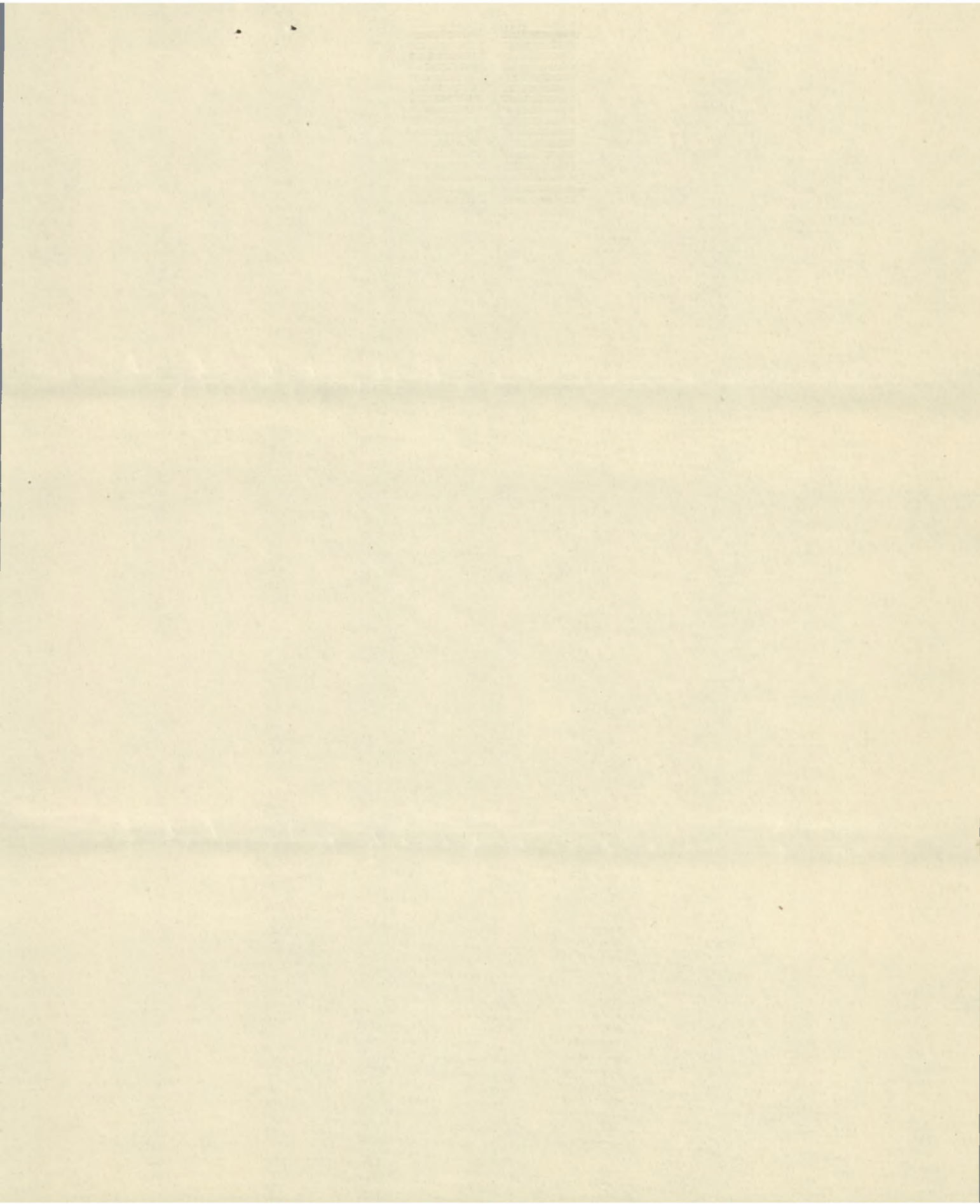
