My Dear Wife:

I spoke at Ames yesterday p.m. and at Arapaho last night- had good meetings this morning, I drove from Arapaho over to Chilton (4 miles) to get the Choctaw each [[?]] Bridgeport when I am to speak tonight. There is a freight which is supposed to go sometime this p.m. out it is very uncertain and I may have to wait for the passenger which don't go until 9o'clock. Though I think I will stait on the freight. There has been nothing very unusual happened, since I wrote you. I was disappointed in not getting a letter from you at

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Arapaho. It seems time I have been away from home a long time. The weather has been fine. I have been well. I hope you have also been well. I came near getting left at Ames yesterday. The train I was to take down to Arapaho left Ames at 2:30 and I had commenced speaking after 2 o'clock- and while I was speaking a man said the train is in = and I was just in the height of my speech= I said good bye and grabbed my coat and ran two blocks- as fast as I could, and got on train just as it pulled out= I think of nothing more to put. With lots of love= your affectionate husband
