Dear Mama and Papa:- I am afraid this will not be a very long or interesting letter for its beginning to get late and it seems I have so much work on hands. It seems the first of the [[?]] the Prof's have loaded the worst and most of the work on us. I supposed they think that we have all been off on a vacation and need a hand of discipline to get us in working order. I've been working on a [[?]] of hypothetical cases on devolution of [[?]] under the different laws and it requires pretty hard work while we [[?]] at it. Then i guess my extra study guides me more work to do. I guess theres nothing to tell about today

except that I've worked most of the time. We did have a class meeting this morning and they did me the honor as give me the "you" of [[?]]. Sunday morning we started out again with our Sunday school class and it started off well. Began with movement next. We did not stay for church there but went across to Mardel Stall and heard Dr. Gifford. It was a fine sermon. Ss you see, Dr. Ames did not preach, but the Pres. of Eureka College look just please so we visit we would rather take chances of hearing a good sermon at Mardel Hall. There was to be a memorial service at the auditorium the afternoon in honor of Theodore [[?]] who died last week and the orchestra was to play so, being free, we went we would go down but the
