Dear Sir:-

The President and his party, the governors of states and the congressmen who are to be in the party going down the river from St. Louis to New Orleans, will assemble in St Louis Monday morning, October 25th.

The congressmen are assigned to the Jefferson Hotel, where arrangements have been made for their accommodation.

When you reach St. Louis, please go to the Jefferson Hotel and ask for Mr. C. F. Beaty, who has charge at the hotel of the arrangements for the congressmen.

The governors of states will be at the Planters Hotel.

The congressmen and governors are requested to go to the Coliseum at eleven o'clock Monday, October 25th, and be on the platform when President Taft makes his address. After the address, they will be taken in automobiles to the Planters Hotel, where they will be guests at a luncheon given by the Business Men's League.

After the luncheon, the congressmen will be taken to the steamboat "Quincy", which will lie at the foot of Market Street, and which has been especially reserved for their use. This boat will leave with the Presidential fleet at five o'clock that afternoon.


Representative Richard Bartholdt, who is the chairman of the committee on arrangements for the congressmen, will be both at the Jefferson Hotel and at the steamboat "Quincy", for the purpose of arranging for the comfort of the congressmen.

It is suggested that the congressmen bring a business suit, in which to make the river trip, and an evening suit for special functions.

Provisions will be made on the boats for steamer trunks for those who may wish to have them.
