Nov the 7th 1904

I was glad to hear that Porter and Clemye was doing well, we have had fine warm fall but to dry for the wheat no snow yet just all Indian summer I like my furnace vary well so far Mr. Weddle does the fireing he finish the coal. I am to no expence in that line Tell Ora she must write and tell me how she likes her new home and neighber. I had a letter from Lou she thaught it was so kinde in you and Ora to take me to the fair and she was so glad that I got John Morris is going to school in Hopkinsvill Kentucky is vary well satefide [[?]] teaching, Ca[e]ry has moved to Clinton bu this time the girls health is better I have give Fred visit up for this year My health is vary good at this time. I am in hopse you will have your health and will like your new home I am all ways glad to hear from you . My love to you both and well wishes,
