Program

Arrangements have been made for two extra sleepers on Penna. R.R. leaving Washington at 12:40 A.M. Thursday, September 18th--sleepers will be open for occupancy at 10 P.M. on Wednesday Sept. 17th.

List of delegation and guests has been furnished passenger representative, Mr. Martin, R.R. Administration in U.S. Capitol--right off main rotunda--secure railroad tickets and Pullman reservations at this office not later than noon Wednesday.

Parties desiring to leave Washington Thursday morning can leave on Penna. train at 6:55 A.M. Thursday, Sept. 18th, arriving at Philadelphia at 10:30 A.M.

It is especially desired that all who can possibly do so leave on the 12:40 A.M., which carries the extra sleeper. This for the reason that the Am. International Shipbuilding Corporation has arranged to launch a ship for the party at Hog Island at 9:30 A.M. Thursday, the 18th.

Automobiles will serve the party from Broad St. Station, Philadelphia, from 6 A.M. on Thursday, Sept. 18th.

Those arriving on the 10:30 A.M. train will be conveyed to Hog Island by A.I.S.C. automobiles. Trucks will be on hand to take care of the baggage of the party to Hog Island. After the launching at 9:30 A.M. a trip of inspection will be conducted through the plant, and the S.S. Tulsa will leave Wet Basis Pier at noon, Thursday, Sept. 18th,--proceed down the Delaware River to breaker; thence down the Atlantic Coast by Cape Henry and into the Chesapeake Bay, proceeding past Old Point Comfort, Portsmouth Norfolk to Newport News, at which point the Navy Department has made suitable arrangements to convey the party (by launch) to the Battleship Oklahoma, where a luncheon will be given by the Navy Department, and presentation ceremonies will take place between three and four P.M., after which time party will disband and arrangements can be made for suitable transportation in various directions ~~xxxx~~ either from Newport News or Norfolk.
