When the State Police arrived. approximately 60 black students were still in the parking lot between the two buildings. This group was broken up and 12 arrests were made at 2:45 a.m. with those arrested being charwith unlawful assembly. Shortly after this time, the distur cance ended, as students returned to their dorms for the night.

Estimates on damages to collese property are in excess of \$5,000, mostly to furniture within the lounge of Pickell Hall and broken windows in both dorms. Estimates on damages to automobiles was not available, though this will add considerably to the final figure.
