From the sound of the afticle il gathered the idea may have come from Jerry Nielsen as the new Student Dovernment President.

" But I most warmly want to con gratulate you or your big-heartedness in accepting his idea for reconciliation especially after reading in the paper the day before of how you had been unjustly arrested when you were only trying to achieve peace. I could appleciate how you felt when you said "The whites can have this school" after all that I am especially impressed with your acceptance of this offer of Priendship and constructive program towards working things out together. We needall the percemakers we can get in this country right row and I pray Lord will give you the courage and strength to stick it out as the leader of the black students in this peacemaking effort. I recently heard an interesting comment. by a missionary to the longo back here on furlaugh. In addition to his high of africa coming out of the mission schools, he said black missimaries

from the U.S. to the Congo found much to their surprise, that after the first few hours of instant rapport because of the color of their skins, they felt enormous differences, because more important than their skin color, was their culture, & they found they were Unericans, not africans. So I do not feel the answer hes in separateness, but in the learning to live together. College students get so many brickbats and so much criticism, I had to write and commend you. Take courage, and God Hess you both and your fine effort. Sincerely,
