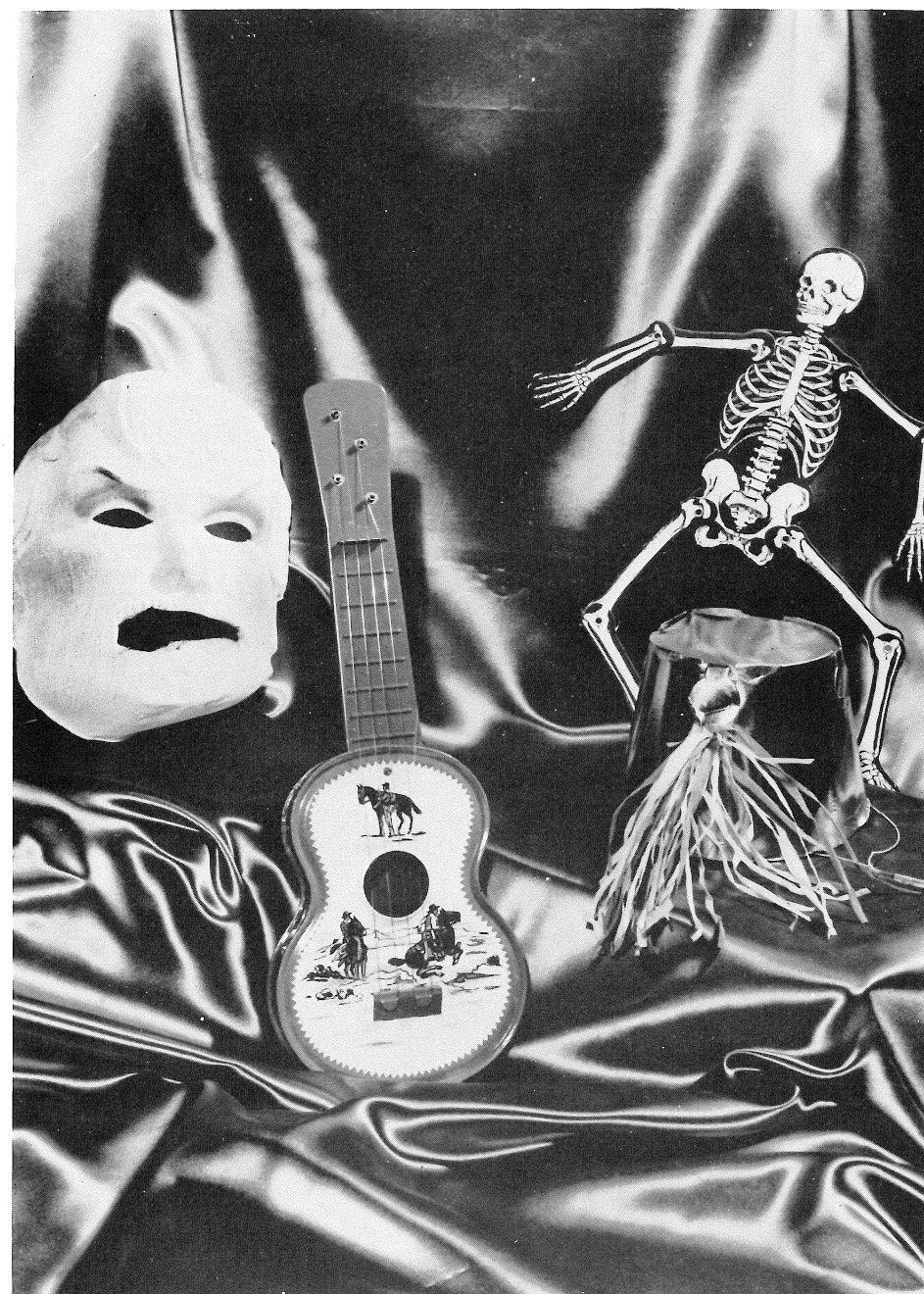


Monday Nighters

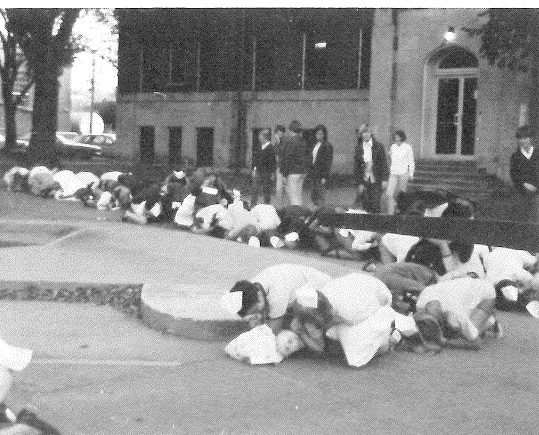

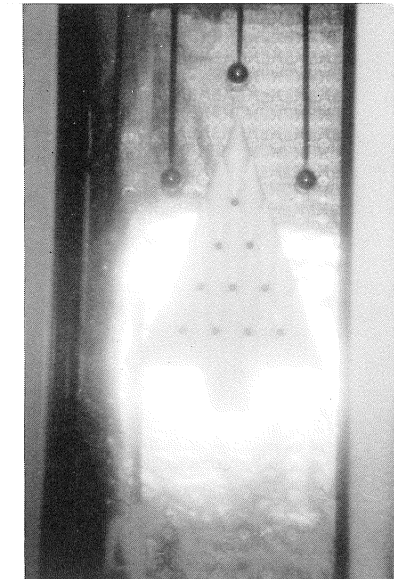
