ENGAGEMENT

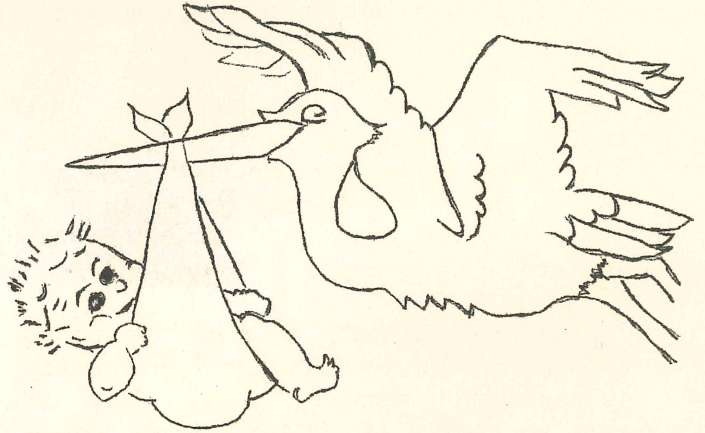
Parents of Waltraud Bley Overlin '55 announce her engagement to Charles Harman of Fremont. They plan a late July or mid-August wedding.

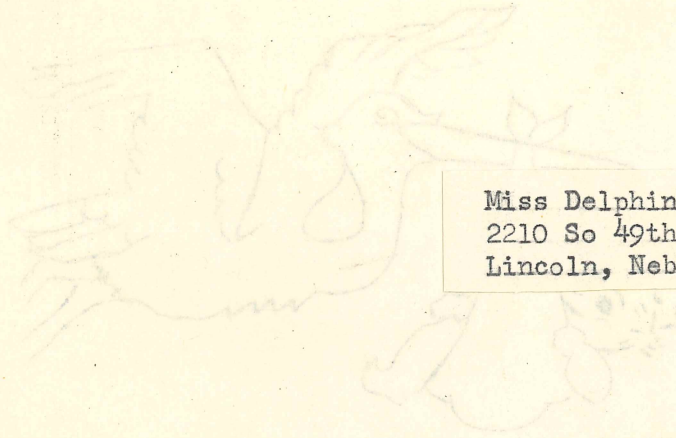
