 BRYAN FUND TOPS GOAD BY \$9,000 (from the Lincoln Journal June 19, 1959)
Cinches Large Building Plan

The Bryan Memorial Hospital building campaign has gone almost \$9,000 over its \$500,000 goal.

Campaign workers attending a recognition luncheon given by Bryan Hospital were told final contributions now have reached \$508,697.98.

Adna Dobson and Charles Sayre, co-chairmen of this campaign, told workers, "you and those who gave have done this for Bryan but in a real sense it is done for our community."

Ernest L. Smith, a leading supporter of the campaign, cited "the campaign success which cinches a \$2.8 million construction program for the hospital as the first step. There will be many more steps to provide the fine hospitals we need in this community."

Editor's Note: In a recent telephone conversation with Mr. Edwards, hospital administrator, I learned that the goal has been exceeded by \$11,000 to date. The "big push" is not over, however, and he hopes to raise this total to \$50 to 60 thousand. Detailed architect's plans will be completed by December 15,1959, contracts will be awarded by February 1, 1960, and construction starts no later than April 1, 1960.

The response to our plea for funds in the last "Notes" was very gratifying, but further contributions are needed!! Many of the alums did not contribute, and we are sure you would all like to have a part in this much needed renovation.
