







#### WHAT IS A STUDENT NURSE

Student nurses are one of the nicest things that

can happen to a hospital.

They come in all sizes, shapes, uniforms and caps. They show up everywhere—in wards, in utility rooms, at chart desks, and in classrooms. Doctors yell at them and head nurses criticize them; interns tolerate them, and patients love them.

#### THE STORY OF THE NURSE'S CAP

The nurse's cap has always been and continues to be a distinctive and respected symbol of those in the nursing profession.

It is thought to have originated when all women wore caps indoors.

The earliest nursing cap was designed by Florence Nightingale in 1860 for her English nursing school. They were fashioned in a form of an old-time dust cap, as in those days nurses also did the heavy dusting and cleaning. Besides wearing them with the customs of the time, nurses wore them as a sanitary measure to cover their long hair. However, they were somewhat unattractive so this style eventually gave way to one designed to cover only the knot of hair on top of the head. Most caps were not washable, and those with fancy frills required special washing.

Around 1910, for reasons of economy and cleanliness, the caps became quite simple in design and washed easily. The use of black bands on the caps of graduates or seniors developed at this time also. This shows the military influence attempting to show rank. However, this practice has somewhat declined in recent years.

Today the nurse's cap is a token head covering. Most caps have beauty and eye-catching perkiness and they symbolize the nurse's lofty dedication to serve mankind.

Although the caps cost little, the right to wear it cannot be bought by the wealth of a millionaire. It can only be bought by meeting the requirements of a certain school in professional knowledge, ability, and devotion to obtain this coveted reward.

The cap is the badge of distinction between schools of nursing. Although similar, there are no two exactly the same.


Bryan's cap has remained essentially unchanged over the years. The white, unadorned cap is awarded to women students following the successful completion of the first two semesters and the summer session. At the same time, the student pin is awarded to the men.

The pin is yellow gold and small in size. On it is Florence Nightingale's lamp which represents the light of learning and three books signifying three years of knowledge. The name "Bryan Memorial Hospital" is written on the outer edge of the pin. This pin has also remained unchanged during the history of the school.

In conclusion, even though the pattern and the purpose of the nurse's cap has changed throughout history, it still remains a symbol of dignity and dedication to the nursing profession and is worn with great pride and honor.






