The following figures will give everyone an idea of the increased percentage of bed occupancy at Bryan in recent years:

1954120	bed	capacity723%
1955120	bed	capacity775%
1956120	bed	capacity841%
1957125	bed	capacity88 %

Bryan had 4,000 more "patient days" in 1957, making the number of admissions equivalent to a 160 bed hospital.

The baby population has also increased. During 1957 there were 740 live births at Bryan compared to 560 live births in 1956.

### AROUND THE HOSPITAL

Mabel Johnston (132) is now Director of Inservice Education for practical nurses and auxiliary workers. This is a new program which was inaugarated at Bryan the first of this year and it seems to be progressing

very satisfactorily.

Bryan has applied for Hill-Burton funds for additional construction to increase the bed capacity to 200 beds. It is hoped that we will receive these appropriations when the applications are approved later this year by Congress, If the appropriations aren't granted, other means of construction will take place; whereby an additional two floors will be added to the front portion of the hospital and second north will be converted into an O.B. Dept. Surgery will then be extended to include the present Mursery and Labor and Delivery Rooms.

A number of rooms in the hospital, including all of the O.B. ward, have new furniture in pretty pastel shades

with hi-lo beds.

Five rooms of the new ultra-modern laboratory were opened March 29. The remaining two rooms of the new addition will not be ready for use until the present laboratory has been reconstructed.



Hany of the graduates will remember Edith Blanche Williams, pharmacist and instructor of Drugs and Solutions at Bryan for many years.


