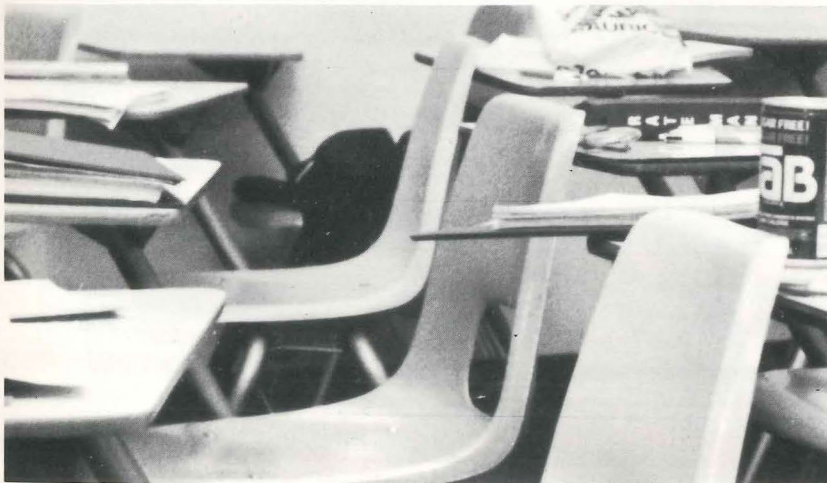

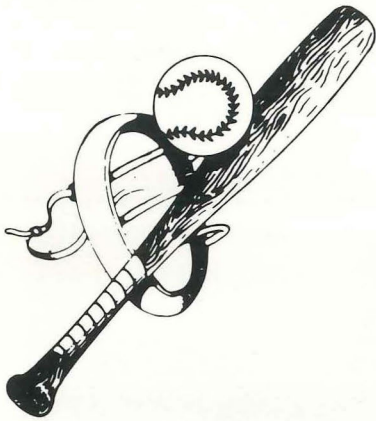

The Doctor E. B. Reed Memorial Award is given annually to a member of the graduating class who has demonstrated excellence in bedside nursing.

The Mary Owens Portrey Memorial Award, established by the family of the 1970 graduate, is given to a member of the graduating class in recognition of outstanding achievement as a nursing student. Selection criteria include scholarship, personality, and leadership abilities demonstrated during undergraduate years.

The Barbara Downey Memorial Award, established by the family of Barbara, who was a member of the Class of 1977, is given to the graduate, chosen by classmates for her/his ability to share a part of themselves with others and who is competent and conscientious, compassionate, honest, sincere, and enthusiastic and involved with life.

The Faculty Award is given to the graduate who has exhibited outstanding achievement in scholarship and leadership abilities.

The Bryan Memorial Alumni Association Honor Awards are given annually to the members of the graduating class having the highest and second highest scholastic standings.

The Bryan Service League makes annual cash awards to the graduating senior ranking first, second, and third scholastically.

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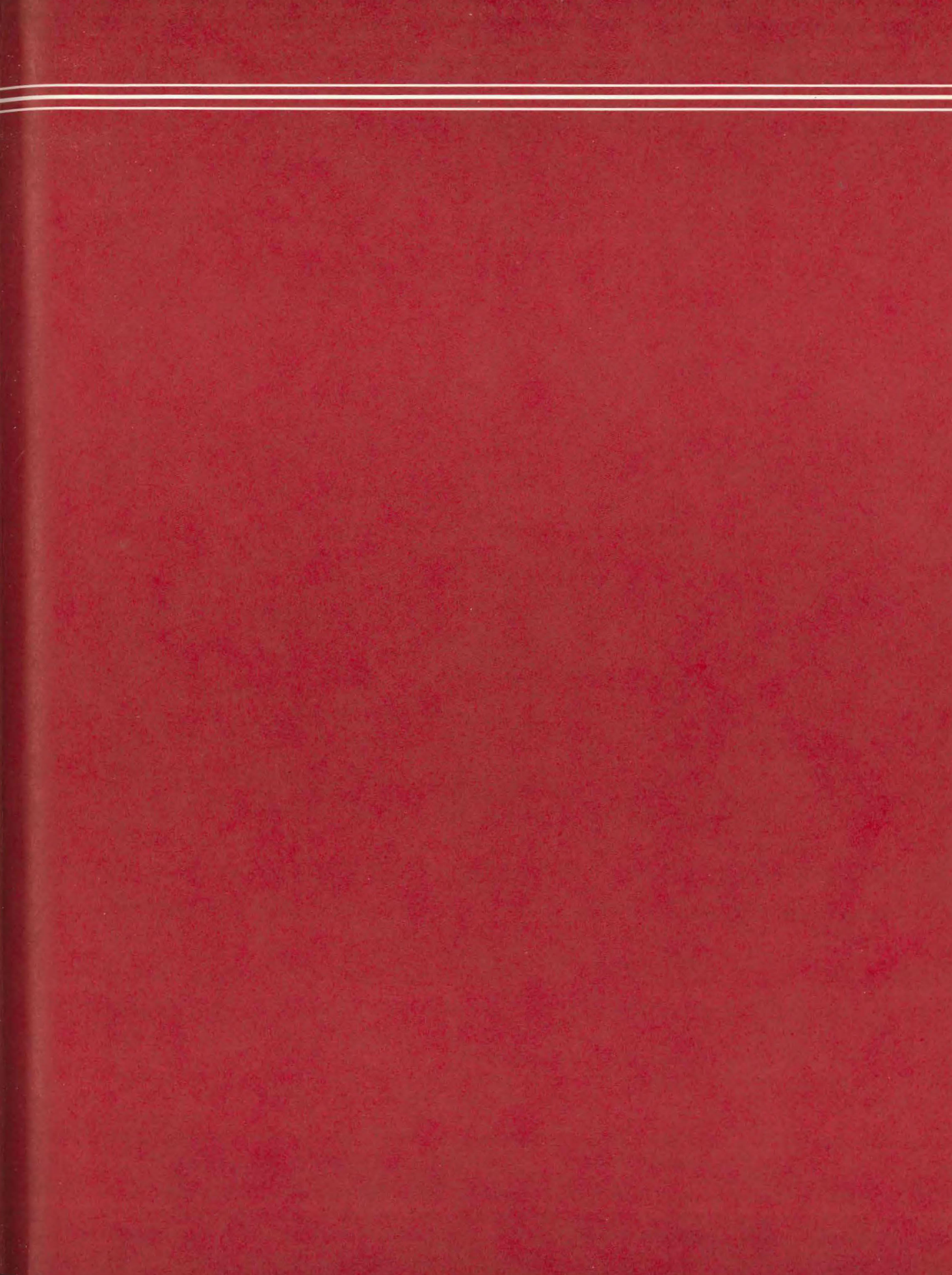
