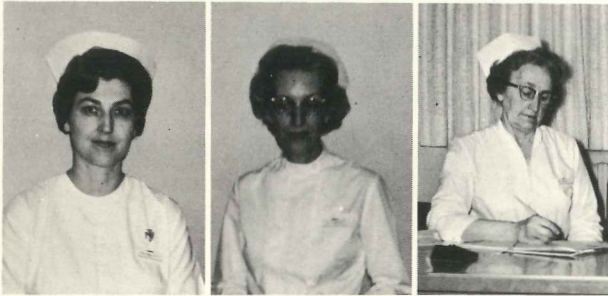
EUGENE G. EDWARDS

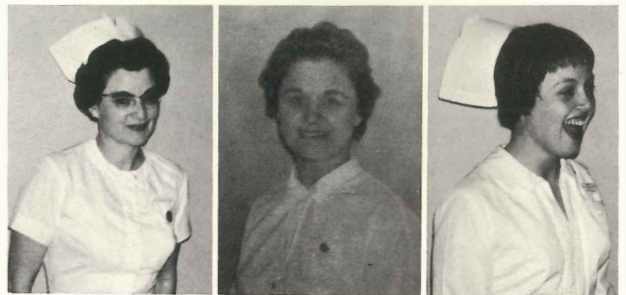

A recently opened area is the intensive care unit which provides constant intent nursing supervision.



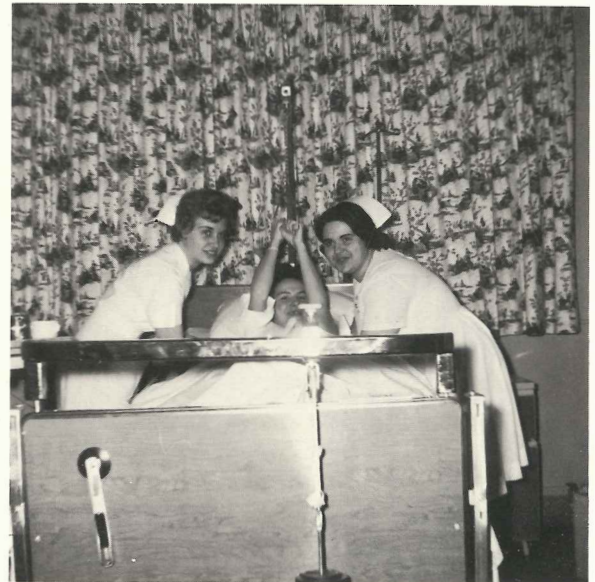
SELF CARE

Another new area for the care of surgical patients is 4 East. This area also provides the full regimen of pre-operative and post-operative care.

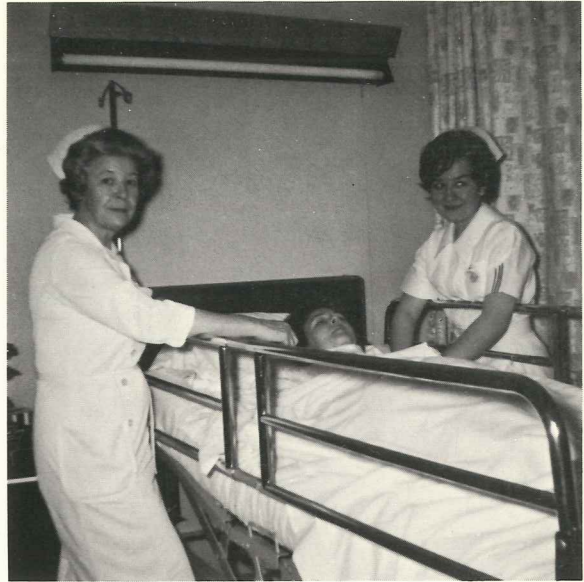

The Psychiatric ward is a new area where patients may be treated privately for short periods of time.



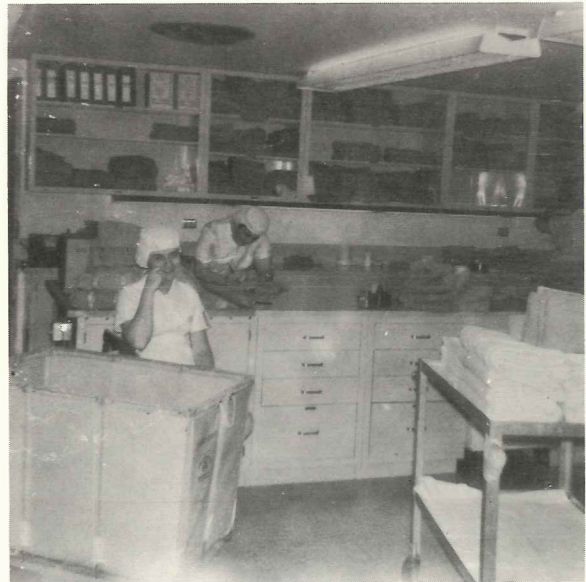
3 WEST SURGICAL

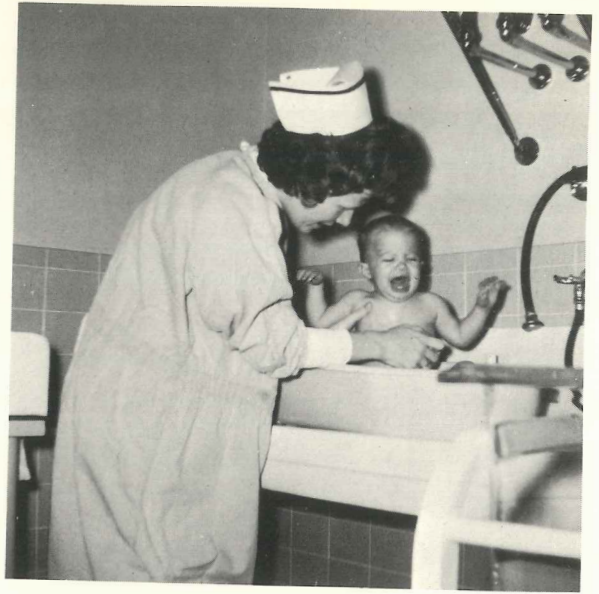
4 West is one of the newest areas where patients with medical problems are diagnosed and treated.

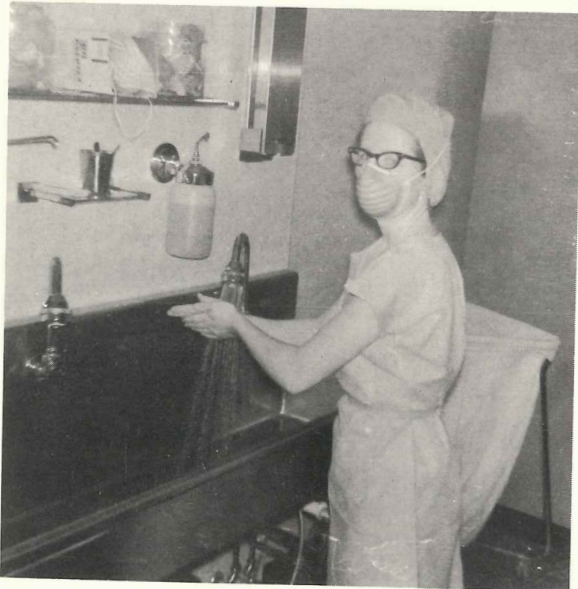
OBSTETRICS

A Winter Dance and a Spring Formal were among the social events sponsored by the student body.

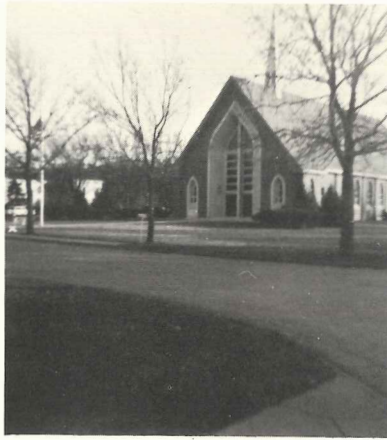
Bonnie Stock served as Student Body President first semester and Wyoma Neimier served as President second semester. These girls were to be complimented for their fine leadership.

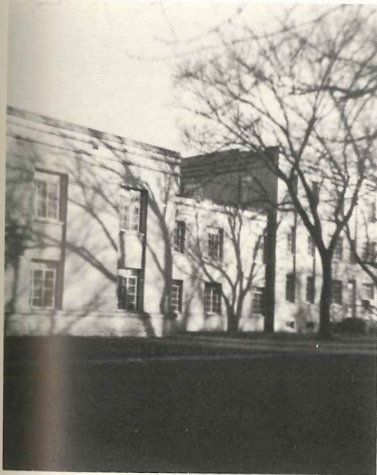

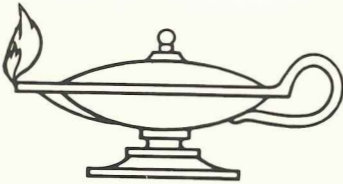

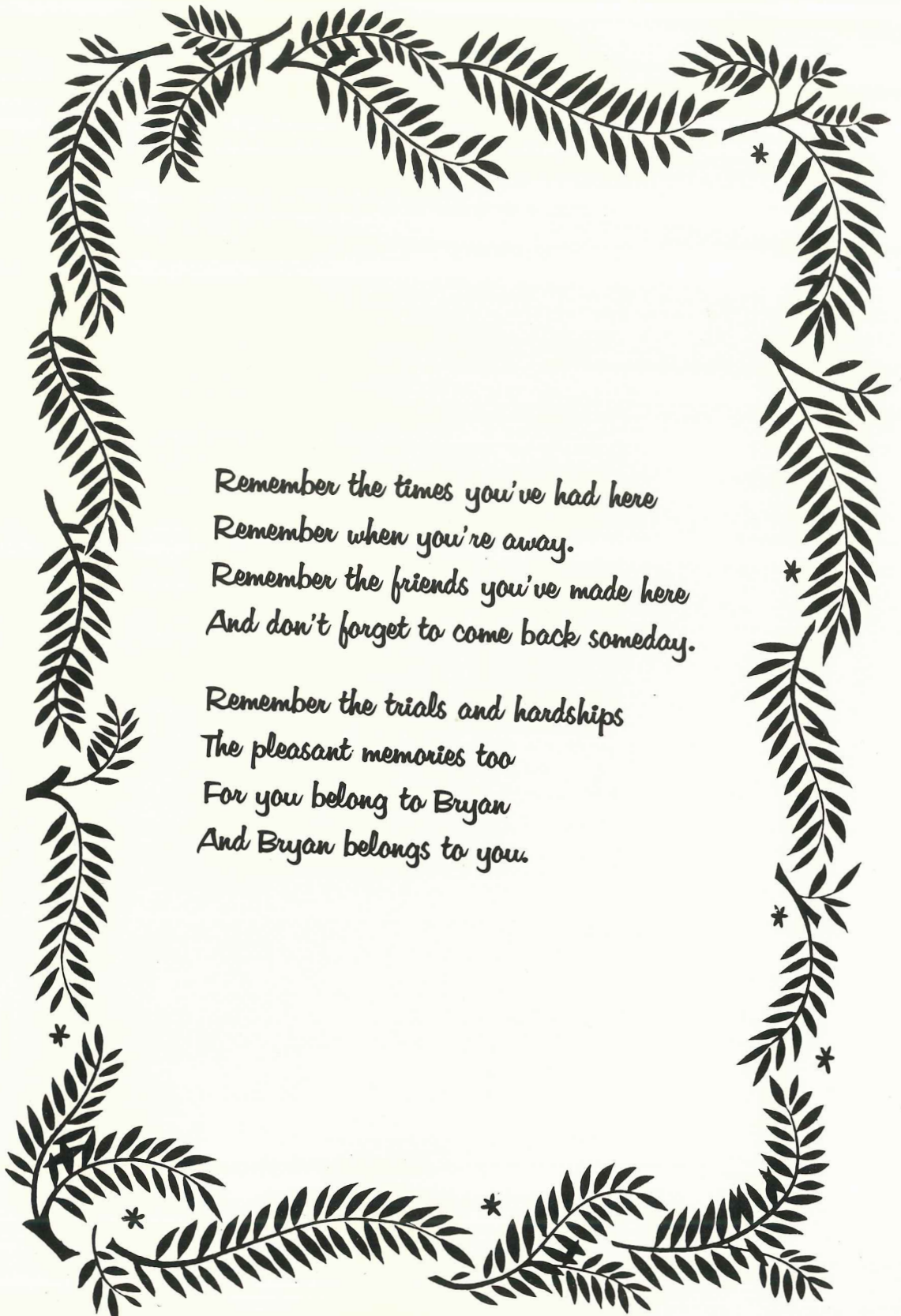


DR. LAVERNE F. PFEIFER
