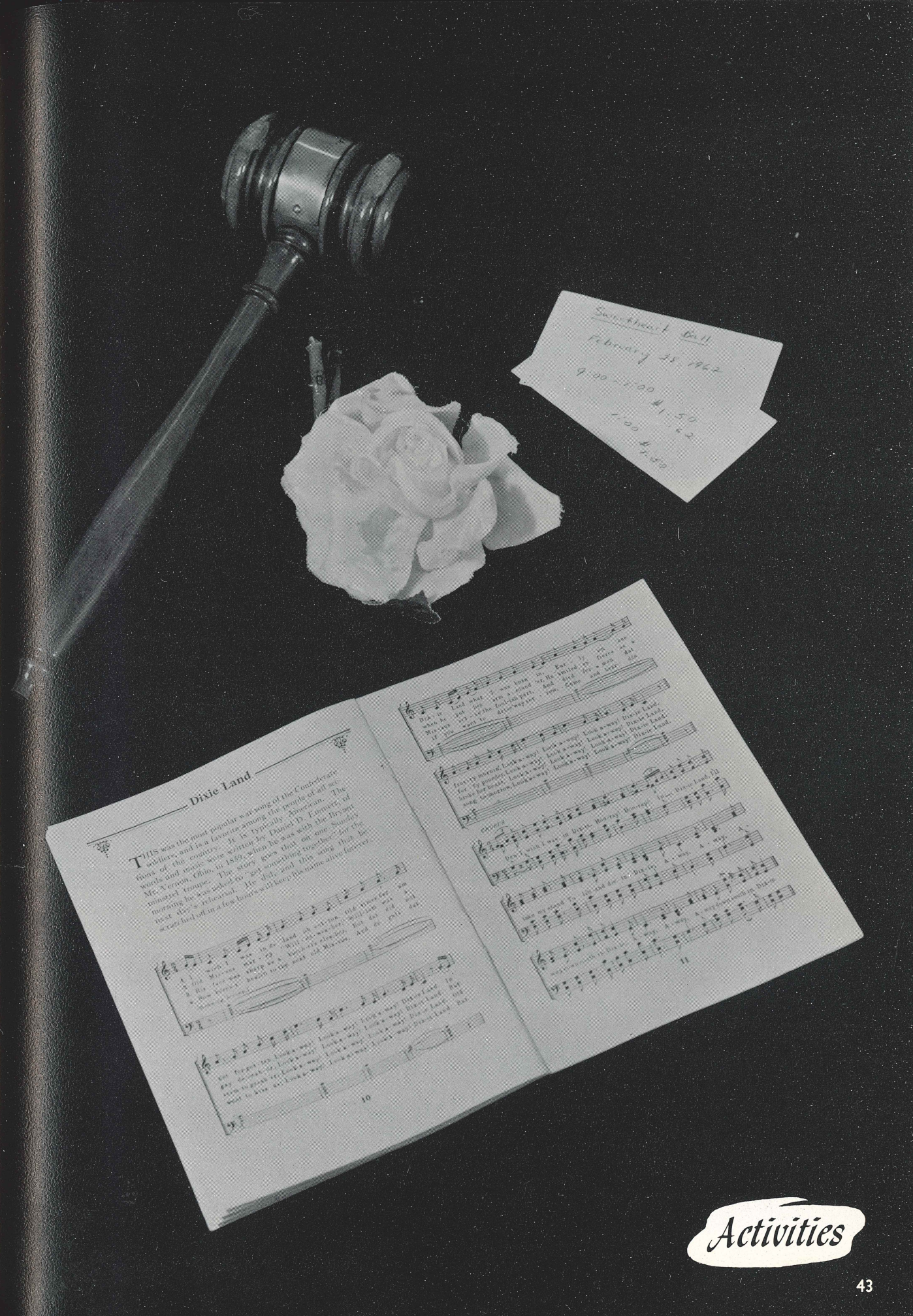
### PEDIATRICS

Graduation was held on August 24, 1962, at St. Paul's Methodist Church. Mayor Boyles was guest speaker.

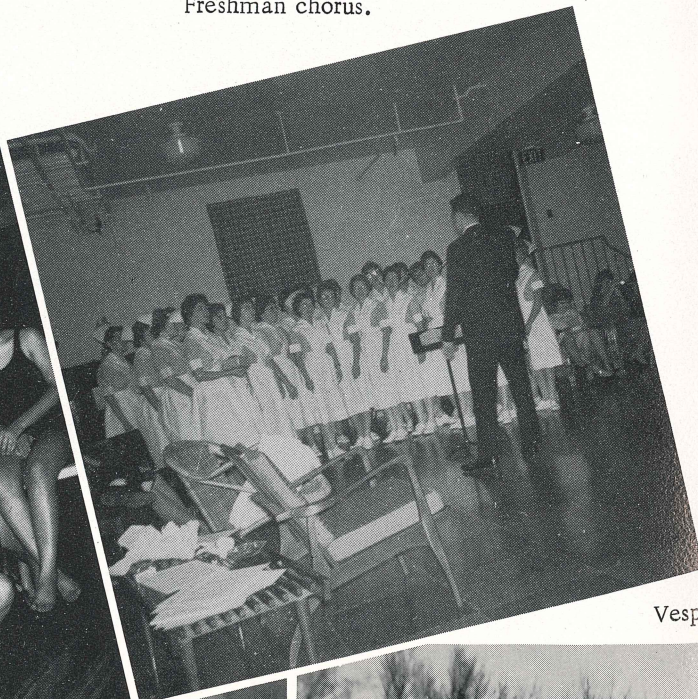

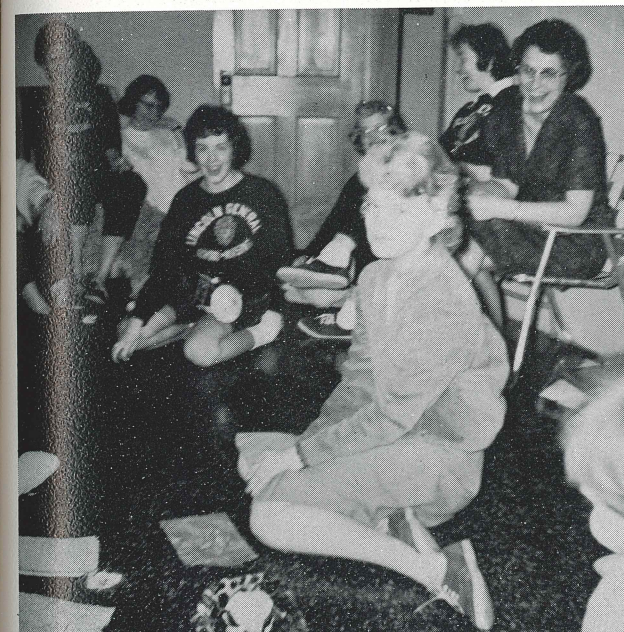
