#### BryanLGH College of Health Sciences

In 1922 William Jennings Bryan gave his home, "Fairview," and surrounding land to the Nebraska Conference of the Methodist Church for the purpose of establishing a new hospital in Lincoln. With his gift and others, a dream became a reality when, on June 6, 1926, Bryan Memorial Hospital opened a 60-bed hospital. The Bryan School of Nursing opened the same year, enrolling 37 students in its first year of operation. Fairview was used as the student dormitory.

BryanLGH Medical Center has continued its commitment to providing quality health care. Today, the Medical Center serves as a 620-bed regional healthcare center. The comprehensive care and treatment facilities available at BryanLGH make it possible for our skilled staff members to provide the best and most modern health care. A complete range of inpatient and outpatient diagnostic, therapeutic and ancillary services are available.

The BryanLGH Medical Center and the School of Nursing built upon the strengths of both organizations with the creation of the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences. The College enjoys a close clinical partnership with BryanLGH Medical Center.

In 2001, the Nebraska Coordinating Commission for Postsecondary Education approved the School's request to become an undergraduate degree-granting institution. To address changing needs in both healthcare delivery and healthcare education, the College began plans to replace the Diploma program in Nursing with a Baccalaureate program. The first class of students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program in August 2003. Continuing on the diploma nursing history of maintaining specialized nursing accreditation, the baccalaureate nursing program received its accreditation from National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission in 2009. The College has also established Associate degree programs in Allied Health. The first students enrolled in the Cardiovascular Technology Associate degree program in 2002, and the Council on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) accredited the program in 2004. In August 2005, the School of Allied Health began offering an Associate of Science degree in General Sonography and graduated the first students from the program in May 2007. The program received Initial Accreditation from CAAHEP in 2008. Soon after BryanLGH College of Health Sciences received undergraduate degree-granting status, planning began to explore the feasibility of delivering the graduate Nurse Anesthesia program through the College. In May of 2005, the Council on Accreditation for Nurse Anesthesia Program approved the College's request to transfer its academic affiliation from the University of Kansas to the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences. The School of Nurse Anesthesia has been associated with the Medical Center since 1967 and enrolled its first class of students in August 2006 with the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences. Today, BryanLGH College of Health Sciences is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission and is a member of the North Central Association.

In addition to degree-granting programs, the College offers continuing education for faculty, nurses, and other health care professionals. The College also reinforces its belief in evidence-based practice and education through the Research and Professional Practice Center, a division that provides research support for faculty, students, and BryanLGH Medical Center constituents.

The College has maintained the goal of excellence that was emphasized by its founders and continues to prepare healthcare providers with professional skills, awareness, interest and concern for health care.

Today we celebrate as we witness the awarding of the master degree to ten graduates in nurse anesthesia, baccalaureate degree to twenty-eight graduates in nursing and the associate degree to ten graduates in allied health. Our first benefactors Mary Baird and William Jennings Bryan looked into the future when Mr. Bryan reportedly prayed this prayer, "To live in mankind is far more than to live in a name. Grant that your servant William will live in mankind." Each graduate of the Bryan Memorial School of Nursing, and now the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences is a testimony that his prayer is being answered 80 plus years later. William Jennings and Mary Baird Bryan's legacy of service is sustained through these 48 graduates today.

The first students enrolled in the Cardiovascular Technology Associate degree program in 2002, and the Council on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) accredited the program in 2004. In August 2005, the School of Allied Health began offering an Associate of Science degree in General Sonography and graduated the first students from the program in May 2007. The program received Initial Accreditation from CAAHEP in 2008. Soon after BryanLGH College of Health Sciences received undergraduate degree-granting status, planning began to explore the feasibility of delivering the graduate Nurse Anesthesia program through the College. In May of 2005, the Council on Accreditation for Nurse Anesthesia Program approved the College's request to transfer its academic affiliation from the University of Kansas to the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences. The School of Nurse Anesthesia has been associated with the Medical Center since 1967 and enrolled its first class of students in August 2006 with the BryanLGH College of Health Sciences. Today, BryanLGH College of Health Sciences is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission and is a member of the North Central Association.

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The College has maintained the goal of excellence that was emphasized by its founders and continues to prepare healthcare providers with professional skills, awareness, interest and concern for health care.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, the faculty, and the staff of BryanLGH College of Health Sciences, I want to congratulate each of you on the achievement of this significant milestone. My congratulations extend not only to the students who have completed the requirements for the Baccalaureate and Associate of Science degrees but also to the family members, friends, and supporters of these graduates—for this achievement was not done in isolation. Each graduate who will be walking across the stage and receiving his or her diploma represents years of effort resulting in their superior education as students and as people. Ultimately, this day allows us to acknowledge these graduates' holistic development as citizens, critical thinkers, and aspiring care providers.

It is the privilege of each member of our faculty and staff to be a part of this moment and to have played a role in the personal and professional growth of the graduates here today. Those who engage in the educational enterprise share a common passion with those who devote their lives to providing quality healthcare to patients: a strong desire to serve the greater good. Perhaps the most significant result of today's graduation ceremony is the formal admittance of these students into the ranks of those who will give their energy, time, intellect, and empathy to improving the lives of their fellow human beings. I cannot think of a greater calling or a more important reason to celebrate this graduation day.

Congratulations on your achievement, your commitment to serve, and your willingness to embark on a journey that will make a difference in our community for decades to come.




