The Baltimore Neighborhood Collaborative would like to invite you to discuss the concept of a training institute for Baltimore area organizers. The meeting will be on Wednesday, May 23, 2001, 12:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. at 2 East Read Street, 8th floor conference room.

For quite some time a number of people have been discussing the need for a local training program for organizers. Recently the Baltimore Neighborhood Collaborative received seed money to pilot such a program for our grantees and other organizations in Baltimore. We hope that this pilot can be a catalyst for an on-going training program for organizers to provide skill development and peer networking support in their efforts to strengthen their community outreach, community organizing, and neighborhood planning work.

We are asking you to join a small work group to develop this initial pilot and to plan a longer-term effort.
