




A recently built Post Office for Portland provides its citizens with new facilities.




These are only a few of PORTLAND'S new highlights.

A fairly new program, Office Occupations, presently occupies the stage. This is evidence of the school's growth and progress.






Wide storehouses of knowledge are waiting to be opened through keen and alert observation.

A familiar scene at every gridiron contest is the cheering squad for the football team.




