The annual stunt night will be held on November 29 and 30. The event will feature a variety of stunts and performances. Tickets are available at the school.

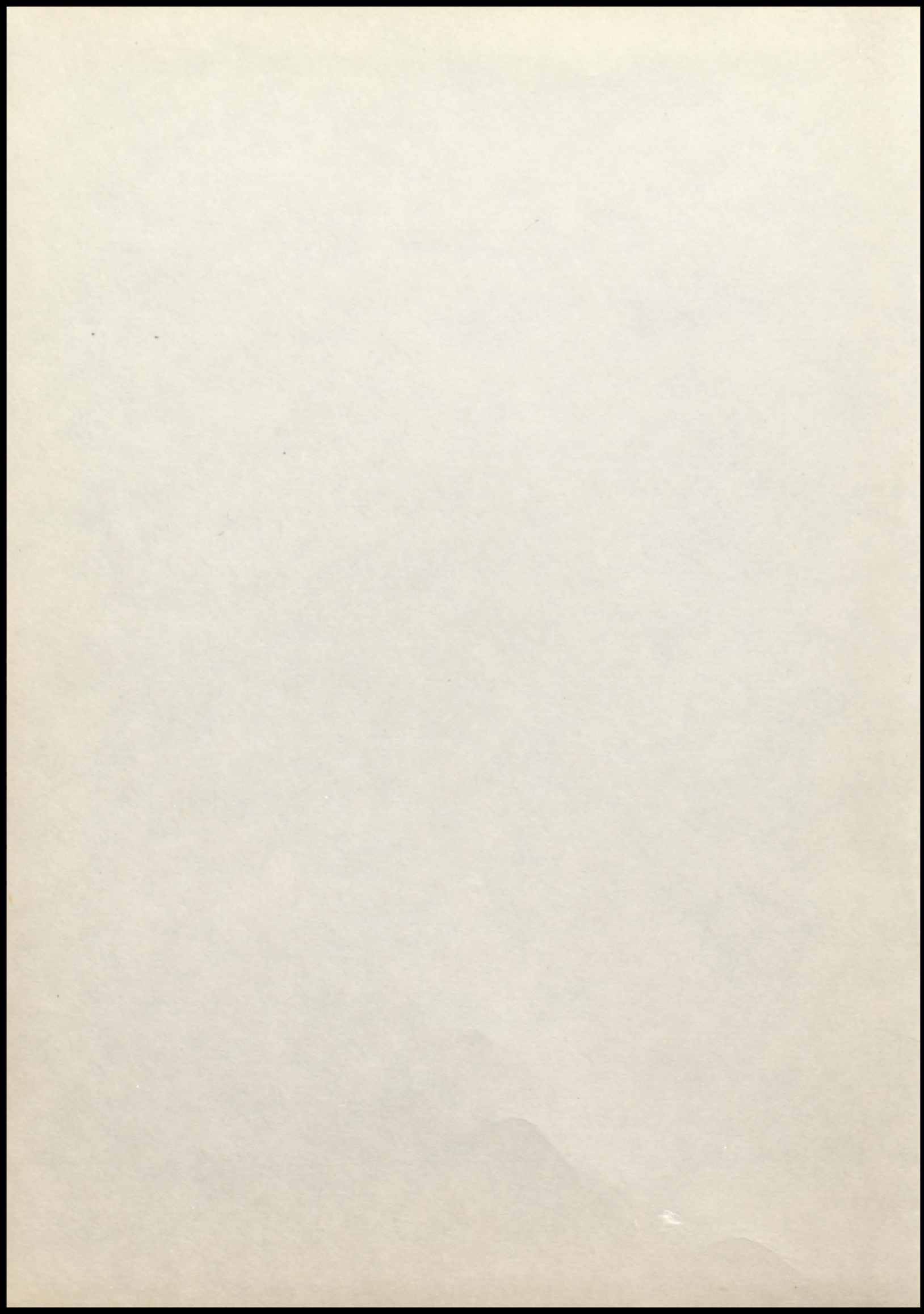

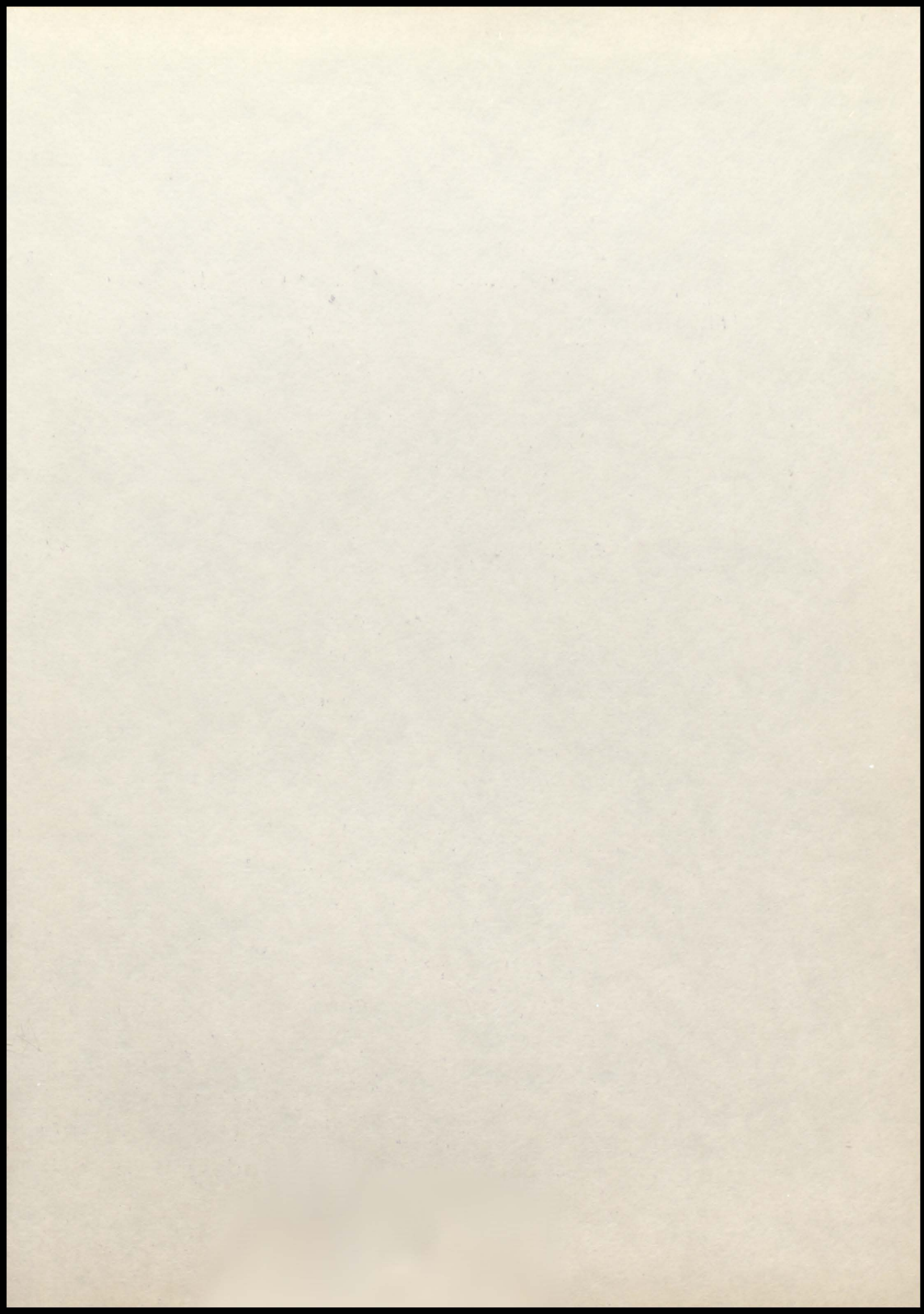














### Antioch, Portland Win Debating Honors
