CLASS POEM

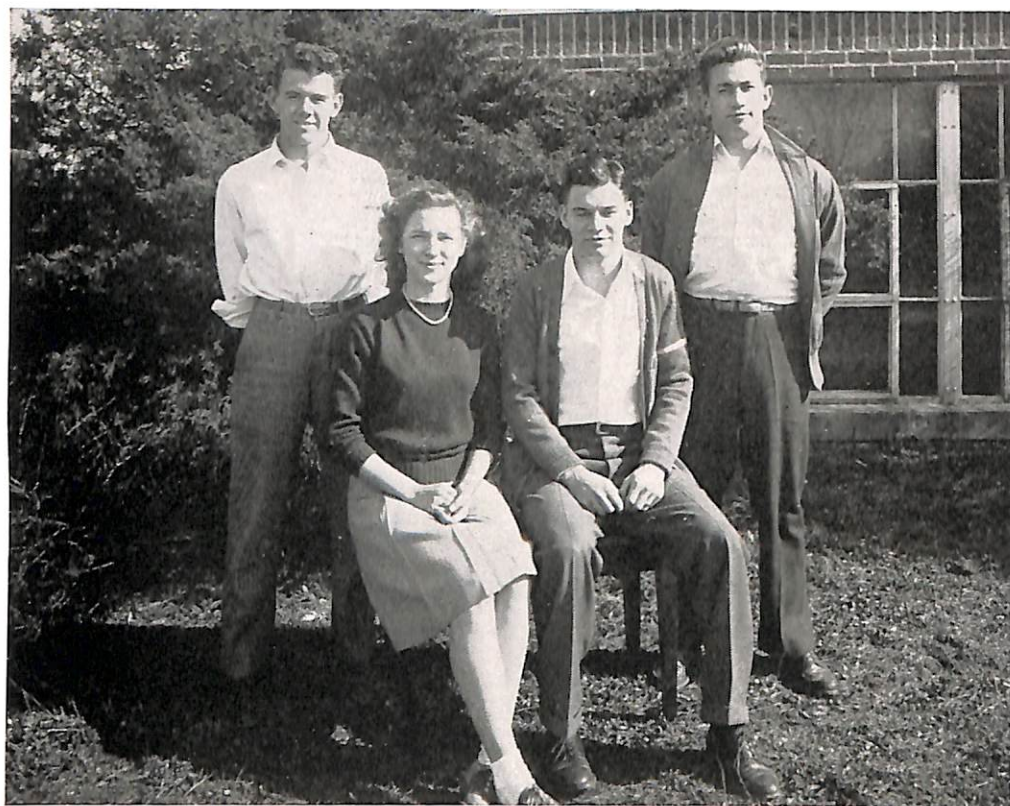
Four years—that have passed so swiftly,
