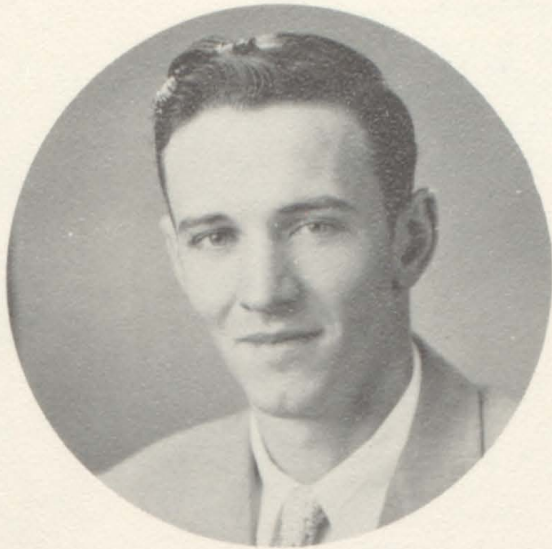
Foreword

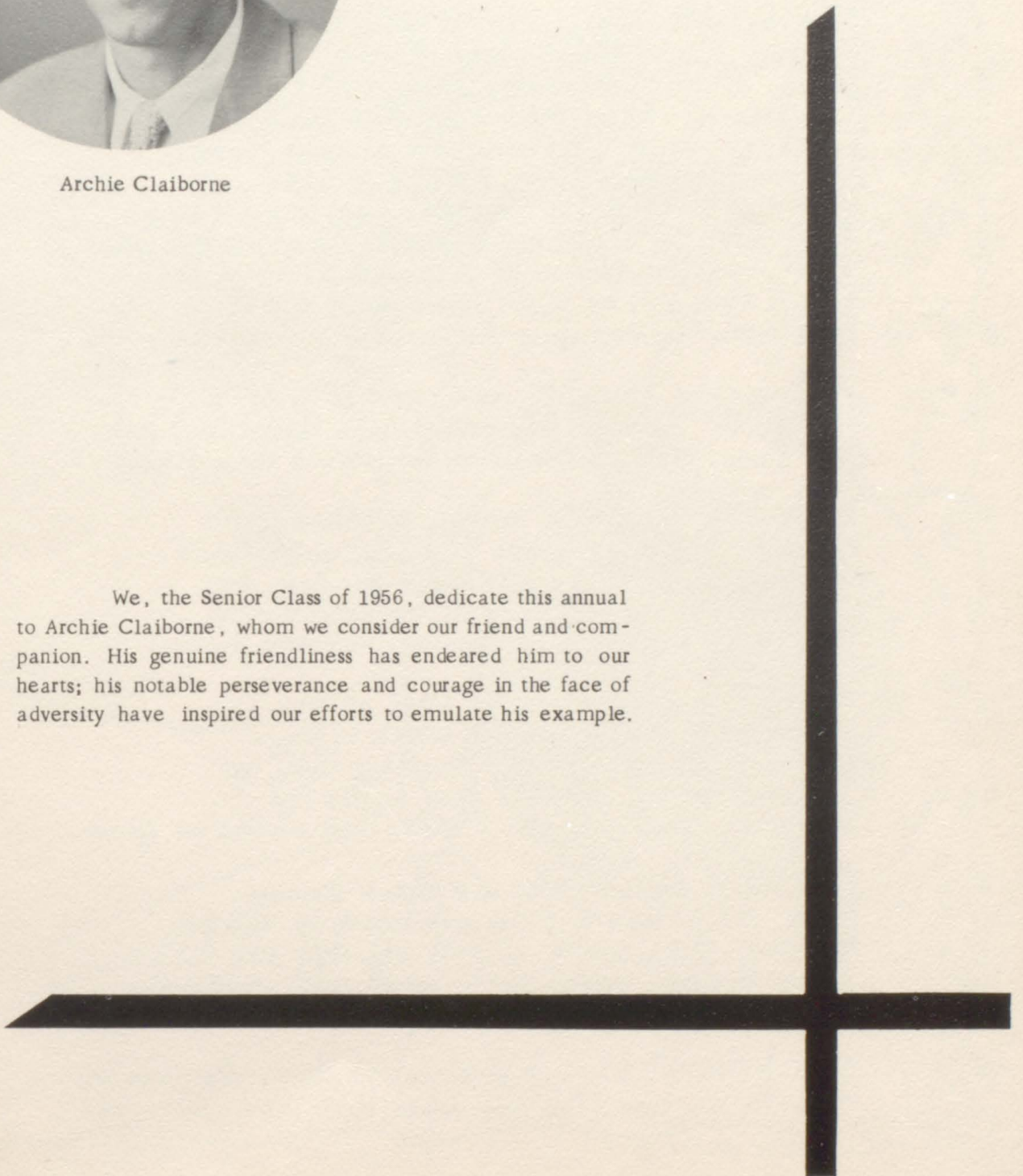

Are then revealed as all the good in life.

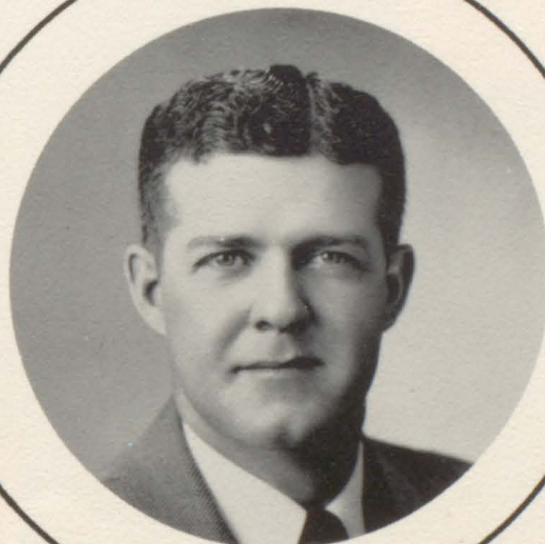
You have all learned just what these pilgrims do;
