Our year has been long and in some respects hard, but we feel that everything we did was worth the trouble we had in doing it.

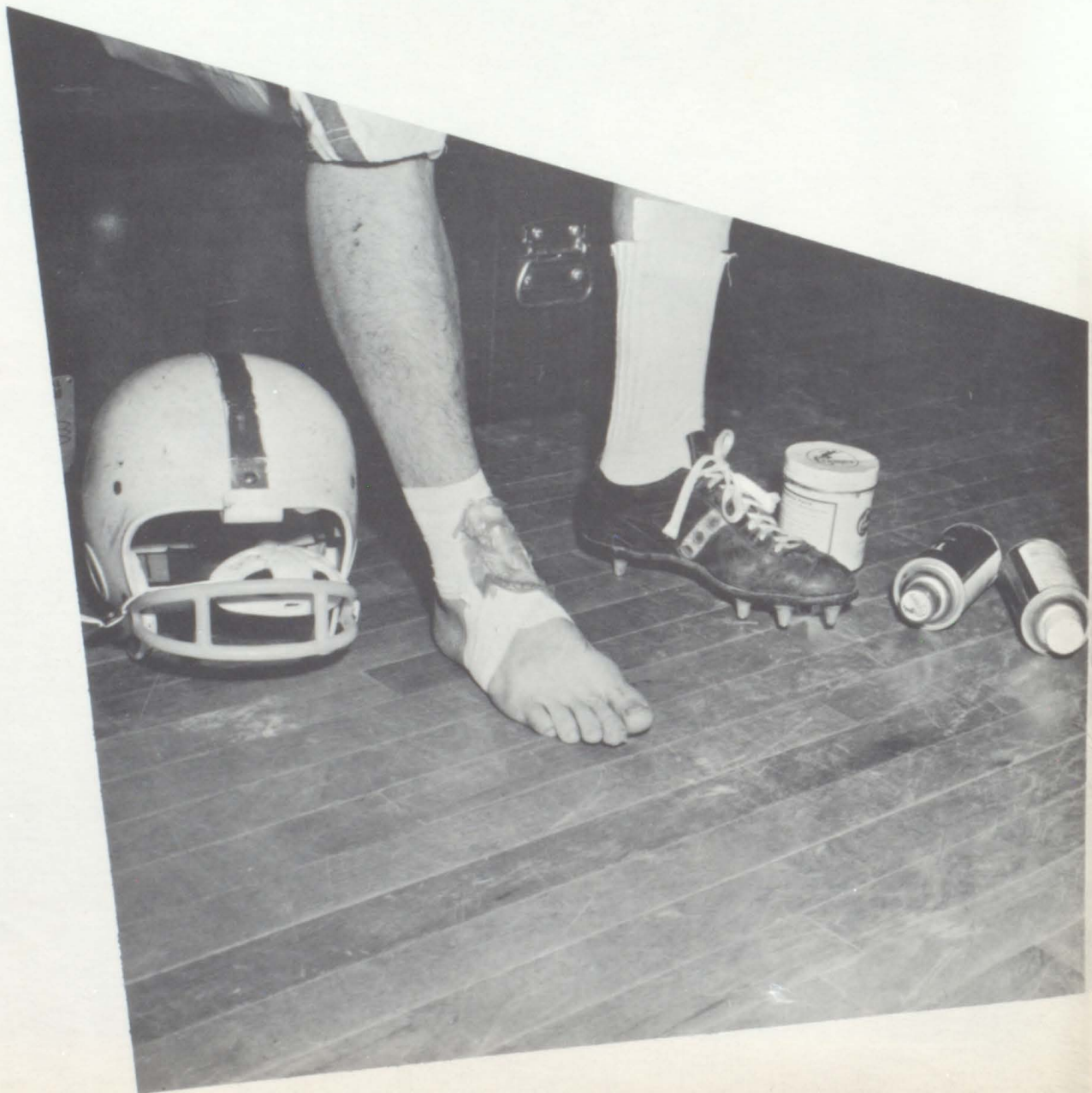
