On the following pages, we will step inside the building for a bird's eye view of rooms which form the setting of the SCHS story.

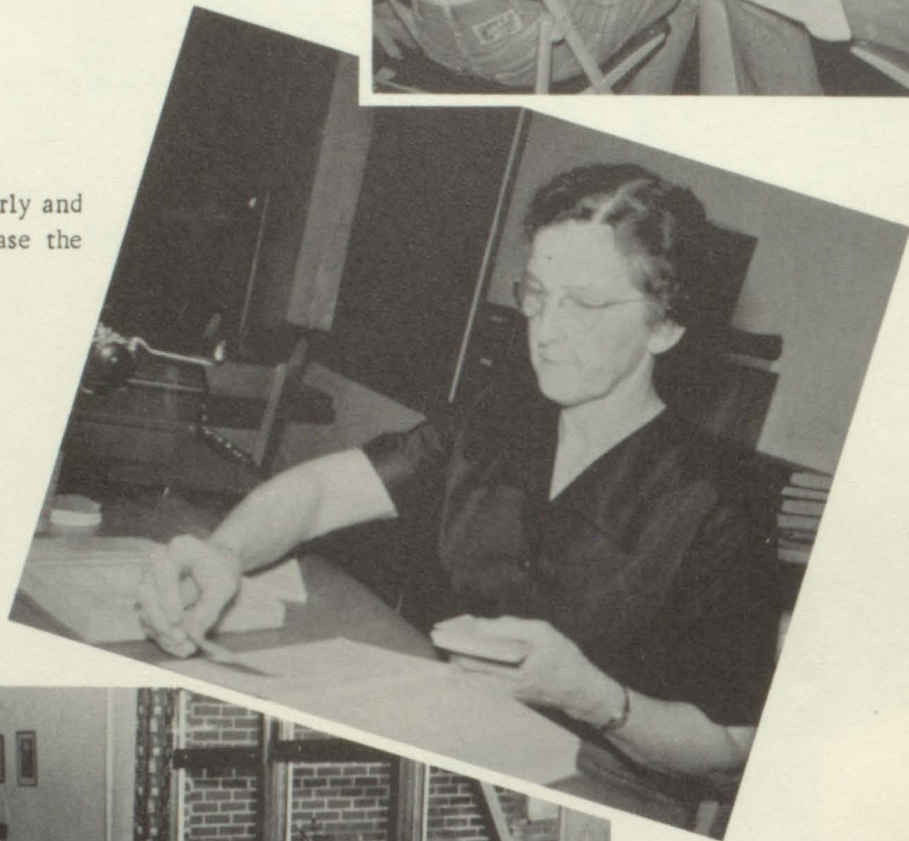

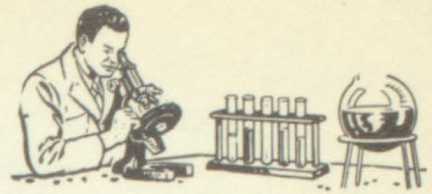

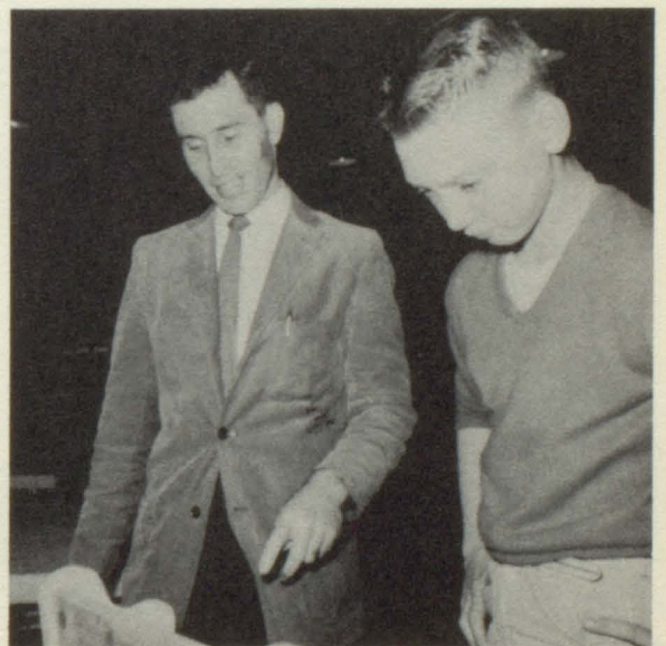

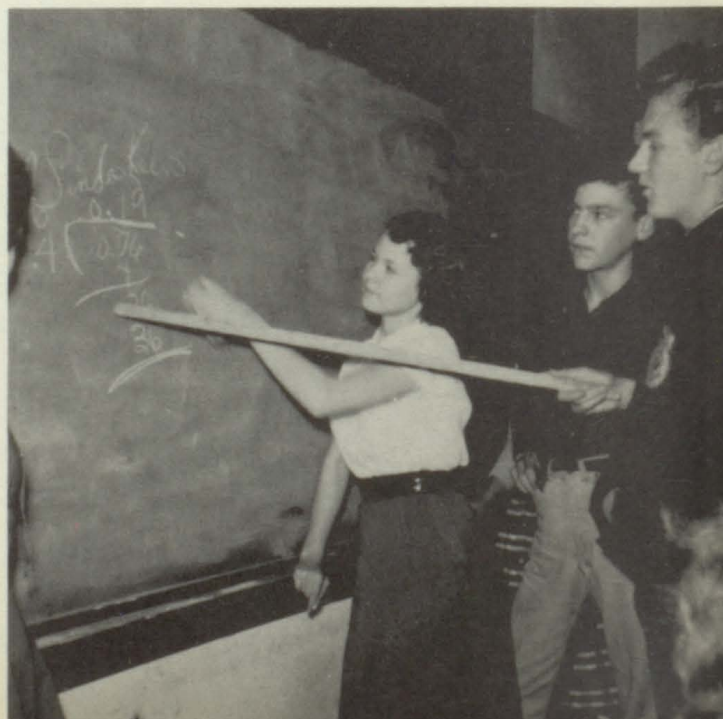

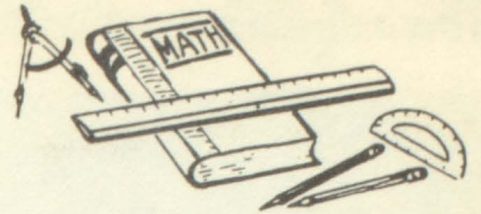
