# Library head pledges community involvement

TENAFLY - At an open house celebration held at the public library recently, the library's new director Alfred N. Garwood promised to work toward enriching the public library to become a "true community cultural center." Garwood, who assumed the directorship Oct. 2, told the gathered dignitaries and citizens that he hoped to make the library "an even more vital, more important, more significant part of the life of the community." Pledging to work with the trustees and the Borough Council, he plans to explore new ways to do this in coming months.

"Libraries are not just warehouses for books" Garwood said, and asked for the support of community leaders as well as citizens to help build the library.

Garwood, who holds an MA degree from New York University and an M.S.L.S. Degree from Long Island University came to the library from Randolph Township, where he was director of the local library.
