
Please help us reduce our mailing costs. Our distribution at the bars will increase and we'll have an ample supply available at The Center for your

6. To buy new clothes. I once wore elephant bell-bottoms to a Park Avenue restaurant -- in 1983.


I thought people were noticing my highly-polished platform shoes.
