I helped raise Shawn all these years and I pleaded with her to make sure she had all the legal work done so that Shawn would be protected legally and taken care of financially. She didn't do even one thing, not one.

Dear Readers of LCN I cannot tell you how important it is to have your legal documentation taken care of before that fateful day comes. DO IT NOW!!! Do it today!!! You never know when that last day on earth will be and verbal communications means nothing to the legal system of Florida.

I am not an attorney but I must recommend you see one to take care of these matters. You need to have a Will in which you spell out what you want done with your worldly belongings (every last one of them, You need to state how you want your family to deal with your remains (burial or cremation) and be specific. You need to name someone to be the Executor of your Will. Someone you can trust to carry out the things YOU want done. You also need to have a Living Will. You need to name someone and give them power of attorney to look out for your interests in the event you are still alive but are unable to make appropriate decisions. You need to have a list of Insurance carriers with phone numbers, policy numbers, etc. Let your Executor know where to find all this paperwork, too.

THE MOST IMPORTANT THING IS TO PROTECT YOUR SIGNIFICANT OTHER. If you don't spell things out then the law sees BLOOD RELATIVES FIRST!!!

Protecting Our Kids - Speaking Out Against Pedophilia

The International Lesbian and Cy Association (ILGA), which won a coric victory last summer by gaining United Nations advisory status on human rights, is facing a crisis because of its ties to a pedophile organization.

In October, U.S. officials at the U.N. said they might seek to change a previous vote granting ILGA "consultative" status to the U.N., because one of its members is the North American Man/Boy Love Association (NAMBLA).

First, The Lambda Report - the newsletter of a California group that produced the notorious video, The Gay Agenda - disclosed that NAMBLA is one of the 300-plus groups (including GLPCI) from 50 countries that comprise ILGA's membership. Next, CNN's Larry King Live inflamed the issue and brought it to the attention of several congressmen who pressed the U.S. Mission to the U.N. to react.

Several major lesbian and gay groups - including the Log Cabin Republicans, Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays, and the National Black Gay and Lesbian Leadership Forum - entered the picture, issuing public statements urging the ouster of NAMBLA from ILGA and all marches, parades and lobbying efforts.

Meanwhile, ILGA officials, fearful that they will lose their hardfought campaign for U.N. status, moved swiftly to distance themselves from NAMBLA and a Dutch pedophile group, Vereniging Martijn. ILGA condemned the organizations, refunded their 1993 dues, and asked for their formal resignations. NAMBLA has stated that it is unlikely to comply, and ILGA has promised to bring the matter to a vote at its June 1994 convention in New York City.

children have the right to grow up protected from sexual exploitation and abuse

"ILGA has always taken a very strong, very clear position on the rights of children," said Rebeca Sevilla of Peru, ILGA's co-secretary general. "Accusing us of complicity with child abuse is nothing but political opportunism by the right wing." Hans Hjerpekjon, the other ILGA co-secretary general from Norway (and a gay father), has predicted that the delegates to the world conference will provide the 80% majority needed by ILGA bylaws to remove the groups.


The Executive Committee of GLPCI unanimously endorsed a November letter to ILGA, condemning pedophilia and commending them for their efforts to expel the pedophile groups.

"As parents," states GLPCI's letter, "we struggle to protect our children from homophobia and discrimination. But evrey child needs additional protections - children have the right to grow up protected from sexual exploitation and abuse. "The activities of NAMBLA damage children and destroy families. Around the world, lesbian mothers and gay fathers are declared "unfit" to be parents because of the myths that we are sexual predators and will exploit, abuse and otherwise harm our children. Because groups like NAMBLA keep the myths alive, our children are sometimes torn from our lives."

In November, ILGA officials met with the U.S. Mission to the U.N. to clarify their position. One month later, the mission announced that if pedophile groups remain ILGA members after June 1994, they will seek to have ILGA's U.N. status revoked.



On Friday, February 4th, 1994 at seven o'clock in the evening I was confronted with one of the most Hum unprofessional incidences of my life. I walked outside of an establishment that I was visiting call The Cactus, to find my car in the process of being prepped to be towed away.

The towing company that assisted the business that placed the tow-away signs up was Airport Towing. To refresh everyones memory, this was the same towing company that was found negligent in the incident with the Lala Paloosa concert: the towing company took it upon themselves to illegally tow vehicles away, while the concert was still taking place. The outcome of a court decision left Airport Towing with a hefty reimbursement fee.

The employee that represented Airport Towing that evening conducted himself very unprofessionally. The kindest words out of his mouth all evening to me were, "Shut up Bitch!" He also tried to back out of a deal that was made with me for a forty-five dollar drop fee in cash, to release my car off the truck.

I learned that evening of a long feud that has been taking place for quite some time now between the owners of Specialty Pawn Shop and The Cactus. I personally felt like I should not have to pay literally fo previous ongoing dispute that these two businesses are unable to maturely resolve between themselves.

I would like to recommend to the owner of The Cactus to place No Parking signs visibly on the front door of his establishment stating where the tow-away zone areas are located. I'd also like to encourage our community not to shop at Specialty Pawn Shop since it is guite obvious that an immense amount of discrimination did, and will continue, to be displayed by them. The tow-away sign was obstructed when I pulled into the parking lot of Specialty Pawn Shop after store hours that evening. It is obviously a scam taking place if they are reinforcing their tow-away zones after hours.

The outcome left me with a temporarily damaged brake light. These accidents will, and still are, continuing to happen in the same parking lot next to The Cactus. As a community we must pull together and not fuel the pockets of these small businesses, that will try to continue to use people like "us" to survive.

Discriminated Against in Orlando

In response to Lesbian invisibility at the Spectrum Awards:

I am writing in response to a March article about Lesbian invisibility at the Spectrum awards. I attended the awards ceremony and had a very nice time. I was not nominated for an award (I didn't deserve to be) but several of my friends were. Some of my friends won and some did not, but every one who won an award certainly deserved it. I agree that there were not enough Lesbians represented. However, I completely disagree with the reasons set forth in the March article.

The article stated that winners were only involved in "predominantly male-oriented issues". Look at the winners, is P-FLAG male-oriented? is Joy-MCC? How about AIDS organizations, are we callous enough to say that AIDS is male-oriented? Why should Lesbians get special treatment? Lesbian Activism does not mean someone involved exclusively in Lesbian issues. It means activism (of any kind) by a Lesbian. Even the category is separatist. There was no award for Gay-Male Activism or Bisexual Activism.

So why was the representation of Lesbians so low? Could it be lack of community involvement by Lesbians? GLCS has one woman on its board and try as they might, they can't get any more to step forward and get involved. The Orlando Gay Chorus would love to have more women, but precious few have shown an interest. LCN is a wonderful organization of wonderful women, but it is by Lesbians for Lesbians. There is nothing wrong with that and we have every right to keep it that way, but it is not very community oriented. We as Lesbians have to stop drawing that line between male and female if we want a unified community. If we don't want to be part of a unified community, we can't expect to win community awards.

Yes, there is a problem of lack of Lesbian recognition in the community, but instead of placing blame, let's get out there and do something about i

Dear Lisa,

I'm really glad you wrote in. The questions raised by the outcome of the Sport um Awards gives us a great opport unity to talk to one another again about lesbian politics. (Does it seem to you, too, that it's been a while since the last "great debate?")

First, we're all in agreement that the Spectrum Awards are a good thing, that everyone who won an award certainly deserved it, and that lesbians were under-represented. Please note the chart. I also want to publicly thank GLCS for undertaking the whole idea of community-based recognition awards.

My greatest dispute with your views is the way you portray lesbians and LCN. To say that designating an award for "Lesbian Activism" is "special treatment" and "separatist" is the same argument advanced by our ents that gays and lesbians want 01 "special rights." I think this category addresses the historic reality of lesbian invisibility (i.e., sexism) in much the same way that human rights amendments and Equal Opportunity provisions force people in power to see African-Americans, gays, women, etc. and admit them into the process. The very fact that no lesbians received an award outside this category shows that our lesbigay community still has lots of work to do in this area (as well as that of "equal opportunity").

I would also add that "Lesbian Activism" does mean to me that finalists advance the cause of lesbians. Simply selecting lesbians who are active in the community on any issue speaks to me of tokenism-- which belittles the seriousness of the discrimination that lesbians must face. LeJune has been an advocate for lesbians in this community for many long, trying years and I am very happy she received the Lesbian Activism Award. Similarly, I believe the **Diversity Award should recognize** e who work against discrimination faced by those outside the "acceptable norms" proscribed by the dominant white, middle-class values of

our society-- and our own community. To select people active on any issue just because they are, for example, persons of color, is indeed tokenism just like making a selection simply because someone is a lesbian.

Your letter did prompt me to think hard about what I think "male-oriented" means. As a feminist wending through my way through what too often feels like a landmine of social structures and attitudes created to serve male needs and ways of being, I'm sure that I personally can be quick to over-extend this concept out of frustration. The most important thing I think it was intended to convey is that lesbian-oriented is not taken seriously in our community. You proved this when you said that lesbians working for lesbians is not very "community oriented."

I'm really angry with your assertions that lesbians didn't receive any other awards because we don't "participate" and that to work for lesbians is not only not "community oriented"-- it is divisive. The fact is that lesbians are at the core of almost all of our community's organizations-- as founders, leaders, and participants. Organizations that try to recruit lesbians and cannot had better spend some time soul-searching into their attitudes, goals, methods, cultural orientation, etc. Which is not to say all gay organizations have to have lesbians; I love watching Gay Chorus performances and actually delight(ed) in them being "men-only."

Drawing the line between men and women is not divisive-- sexism is.

Drawing the line between men and women is not divisive-- sexism is. Men and women are different; gay . male culture is different from lesbian culture; African-Americans are different from Hispanics are different from Whites; working-class is different from middle class is different from the lives of the rich and famous; and on and on. These differences don't divide us, they make us stronger and richer and intensely more interesting-- as long as we <u>truly</u> understand, respect, and support one another. That's what the Rainbow Flag is all about.

I hope you don't think that every organization working for a specific group of people (like NOW or the NAACP or GLCS for that matter) isn't community oriented and I hope you'll come to see that LCN is indeed working for the betterment and unity of the entire community by working for lesbians. I'd also add that LCN works in coalition with many lesbigay community efforts-- such as the Spectrum Awards and the Pride Parade. (And I'm especially proud that LCN spearheaded "DC in '93" this past year.)

So don't tell me that I and other LCN members and other lesbians don't participate, aren't community oriented, and that we don't want to be part of a unified community. I firmly believe that lesbians <u>and</u> LCN have earned the right to expect that more than one of us can win a community recognition award.

I'm sure we all want to see more lesbians involved in the community. That's certainly something we promote in the LCN Express. But please don't make lesbians and LCN the cause of this case of lesbian invisibility. We simply identified it in hopes of affecting a more just evaluation in the future of lesbians' work in this community-something that will indeed benefit everyone.

The Bridge — What Don't Kill You, Makes You Stronger

My grandfather's eighth heart attack didn't make him stronger. He died last January. Since then, I've been thinking about death: his, my father's, the very real possibilities of it, that Joey and Katie, the two people I cherish the most faced. These are not fun thoughts. For five hours last year around this time, I had no idea whether Katie was going to live or die. She had been gay-bashed along with three of her friends. One got off okay. One suffered a broken rib. One ended up comatose for nearly a month! Katie was only out a few hours, though she suffered a concussion. She felt guilty too. The boy who spent a month comatose had saved her from rape at the hands of these eight queer-bashers. It speaks volumes about how we've changed that I can write about the incident at all and that she can face it in print.

Thinking about death and queerness, the gay-bashings, the suicide attempts, the slower suicide of alcohol

and drug addiction ...

I read recently that thirty percent of gavs and bisexuals were/are addicted to some substance. Any wonder? In my circle of queer girls, there are two recovering alcoholics. Four girls have attempted suicide. Several of us have been bashed. I narrowly escaped it a couple of weeks ago. Several of us were also threatened with eternal damnation or damnation right here on Earth in the form of punitive psychiatry. One girl was shot by a neo Nazi, one was knifed by her own father. We come from "up North", Cracker Country, Canada, England, Jamaica and Siberia. We represent several races. This shit's universal, and what a shame for every queer that it is. It is all due to homophobia and biphobia, the external hatred as well as our own self-loathing.

When I was thirteen, I realized that my feeling for both women and men were incurable. Though my mother is not a fundamentalist Christian, she was quite homophobic. My other relatives told me

vicious, ugly lies about us. I heard nothing at all good! NOT A DAMN THING! So I attempted to drown n f in the bathtub. Thank God I couldn't do it. (This is one of my short stories.) I also sniffed glue, gasoline, and hairspray. I still live with the consequences of huffing. Though I haven't done it in five years. I do not trust myself around such common items as superglue or whiteout. I started the habit when I was eight. I quit when I was ten. Then resumed an on and off pattern about the time someone told me my crush on another sixth grade girl was immoral. Sniffing is ugly, but here's the thing, you don't have to think too much when you do it. I learned recently that my dyscalcula or math dyslexia, could have been caused at least partially by inhalant fumes, stunting "math sector" of my brain.

One thing I know is that no matter what else I do, I want to keep other queer kids from fucking their lives up. This is why I do The Bridge, that I write short stories, why I'm working on a novel. I am interested in queer related media development for the same reason. Someone has to say something positive Someone has to tell gay and bisexua youth that they are natural and normal, with ability, intelligence and a need for love that is as valid as a straight. Someone has to tell them that they can have kids and good jobs and wonderful committed partners. And if parents, extended families, school, church won't do it, then why not the media?

Generations of queers have turned to books. Simply knowing that Colette and Vita Sackville West were brilliant writers and "bi-like me" helped my selfconcept immeasurable. Katie cherishes a musty worn Russian paperback-a badly, but bravely translated copy of <u>The Well</u> <u>Of Loneliness</u> given to her by an almost stupidly out gay uncle when she was twelve. As book lovers, we've both agitated for more and better queer lit in schools.

Now there's tv, it's okay, not great. That kissy episode of Roseanne was so dismissable except for Sandra Bernhards speech, wasn't it? Mariel Hemmingway and Sandra didn't act like any couple at all really. Perhaps Katie and I are jealous types, but someone's ass wou be kicked if either of us were involved a scene like that. Certainly Sandra's character was way causal. Shannon wanted the kiss hotter, "maybe with some crotchgrabbing!" Maureen wondered why any woman would want Roseanne Arnold. The harshest words of all come from Katie. Mariel, according to hacted out "that same fucking Stone umpy (Russian for easy) predatory

dyke stereotype." HBO's "More than Friends" got better reviews from everybody. It is if you don't know the story of a gay girl who brought her girlfriend to the prom. In many ways, it was on target. The girls around Heidi Leiter, the main character, acted the way I remember my "liberal" straight girlfriends acting as I came further out. The couple acted all cute and loving too. But lord, it was as good-for-you as fat-free organic granola! Boring!

Katie and I try to be role models in our own way. She wanted to be a teacher simply to help other queer/abused kids, but discovered while volunteering at her church day-care center that roomfulls of drive her insane. She'd rather be a faction stylist and work with roomfuls of clothes, makeup and models. (I'm sure lots of girls feel her way.) But she likes to help abused gay teenagers, like Lina. Lina's 13, hit by her parents until she was kicked out for kissing another girl. She is a recent Polish immigrant who had no money and little English when Katie met her. Katie pleaded with her roommate Sal to let her take Lina in. Sal has a soft spot for troubled queer girls, he took Katie in when her father used her hair to slam her against the wall. (Yes that's why she has that radical haircut.) Sal is a gay recovering alcoholic and abused child too, and if this pattern seems repetitive well...

Anyway, Katie's been teaching Lina English as Lina helps refine Katie's Polish. Katie also insists that Lina goes to school and stays away from drugs, including tobacco. Nobody else cared enough.

Queering the Festival

More than 50 theatrical troupes and performers from all over the world are scheduled to take part in the Third Annual Orlando Fringe Festival, slated for April 22-May 1, 1994 in downtown Orlando.

Highlighting this year's event is gay playwright Michael Wanzie's "In Close Quarters", a play about 2 Vietnam soldiers trapped in a fallout bunker for an ongoing period of time. Throughout the ordeal, one soldier must nurse the other back to health from a battle injury. In time, it is discovered that the caregiver is gay and the story line deals with the backlash reaction from the other soldier and the eventual relationship that develops "in close quarters".

No doubt, Michael Wanzie is gifted as I am sure you'll agree if you have seen his work. We are fortunate to have him representing the Gay community in the Fringe Festival. However, the same question comes to mind as the one I heard other women asking after seeing Philadelphia and attending the Spectrum Awards, "Where are the Lesbians?"

That's where I come in. While the Fringe has had gay-themed plays before, only this year did they actively recruit an openly gay member of our community to serve on the Executive PR Council. Having that honor, my job, basically, is to make sure that the Lesbian and Gay community knows that it is personally invited to attend the Festival. This is my first awareness of any citywide event that has decided to actively reach out specifically to Lesbians and Gays. I sure don't recall any open solicitation of Lesbian and Gay participation in Light up Orlando, for instance. The point here is - that even while on some levels (the religious right) we are under siege, on other levels we are making tremedous progress in mainstream participation.


Which brings me back to the previous questions? Where are the Lesbians? In its selection of theatrical events, the Fringe Festival organizers say they do not discriminate. In fact, content doesn't matter. Applying is all that counts. Meaning selection is done on a first come, first serve basis. Terry Olsen, Fringe co-producer, states that their agenda is "to end the fractionalization of society in the hopes of making it whole." Nice idea, huh? So if all it takes is to apply, once again, where are the Lesbians?

I know that I am acquainted with only a fraction of the Lesbians in Central Florida and in this group are some pretty creative people. Given that, plus the women I do not yet know, surely there is one among us that writes and could write a Lesbiansensitive play. So why have no Lesbians yet applied? Maybe they did not know that there may actually be places we can participate without discrimination. Now that you know, will you (whoever you are out there) please get that play in for next year so we can test this inference of total inclusion.

By the way, a number of the plays presented are written/produced by women (sexuality unknown). One in particular, A Woman Called Truth, is especially appealing to me. (It is the story of Sojourner Truth, a strongwilled, stouthearted black woman, emerging from the oppressed land of slavery, desperately searching for her young son.)

Even though women do participate (and it looks like the content of their plays are thoughtful and/or entertaining), like life, male participation in the Fringe dominates. And Lesbian participation is once again invisible. The Fringe producers say, it's first come first serve. When will we matter enough to ourselves to make US known. Camille Paglia suggests that the only difference between gay men and straight men is who they sleep with. She finds gay men more interesting because at least they do something. She calls Lesbians inert. Even though am always suspect to anything Can says, it may be time to look at how much we are willing to do for our own (Lesbian) specific causes.
