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

Membership is open to gay men and lesbian women, as well as nongay persons; the membership is currently growing at the rate of about 10 percent per year.

GCS was granted tax-exempt status by the federal government making it more attractive to donations and volunteer ser-

Its formal structure is made up of president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and a number of committees and caucuses developed to address specific projects and concerns.

- Legal Awareness Seminars, to inform the gay community of its rights and limitations under existing law
- Speakers Bureau, to establish and maintain personal dialog with members and groups of the nongay community
- Public Relations, to inform the community of GCS's services and important
- Monthly Newspaper (New Direction), presenting local and national news important to gay people
- · Library Service, accumulating and loaning publications of interest to the gay
- Gay Blood Bank, Central Florida Blood Bank Account No. GSSCF-6277
- Political Education Committee, provides specific information to the gay community about political candidates and
- Social events, alternatives to the bars, programs to develop cohesion within the gay community, production of gay drama, and support of gay student organizations at local colleges.

GCS is Central Florida's only open gay voice and support organization; as such it is meeting a valid need as gay people become more visible, active, and aware of their legitimate position in society. As its services grow and diversify, GCS's need for financial and physical support grows.

Tax-exempt donations are warmly appreciated. Volunteer work is always in demand. Membershp inquiries are welcome. (See ad this issue.)

With the support of knowledgeable mature people, GCS can become an increasingly viable force in Central Florida for the benefit of the entire community, both gay and nongay. Silence is no longer



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
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

**** 1/2 The Hole, 1910 Red Road (S.W. 57th Ave.) in Miami is probably the closest thing to a levi leather bar as I have found in


The bar, though a bit difficult to locate, is worth going to. It is a location and isn't overly large.

The owners of gay establishments in the Central Florida area are cracking down on underage, would be, customers.
"We check ID's very carefully and have

a reward system for any of our employees who find someone underage in our place of business," Bill Miller, owner of the Parliament House reported.

Jim Nuss, owner of the Silver Hammer and newly acquired Southern Nights, said, "If we doubt an I.D., we won't let them in."

Other bar owners and managers in the Central Florida area have also expressed concern about "fake I.D.'s" showing up as well as borrowed credentials.

"We know who's helping the guys get the I.D.'s and we are no longer accepting those to get in," a bar owner said. "We hope they will patronize us when they reach the legal age but until they are of legal age or until the law changes I have to stand

Babies Can Be Gay Before They Are Born

CHILDREN DEVELOP sexual attitudes before they're even born, claim doctors who recently attended the Sixth World Congress on Sexology in Washington, D.C.

That means sexual preferences - including a desire for either a homosexual or heterosexual lifestyle — may be developed months before the baby is even born.

This startling revelation came to light when an Austrian researcher reported on experiments he had conducted tracing the life styles of children from the prenatal to adult phases of their lives.

"Fetuses often pick up on signals from their homes.

"If an unbor child is exposed to certain

sexual attitudes, he may respond by developing homosexual standards," according to the researcher.

"But so far I have not been able to determine how to control these responses or signals.

"Just like with anybody else, fetuses respond to signals based on their own mental attitude.

Evils

"For example, if the expectant mother is in a group of people who are talking about the evils of homosexuality, the fetus could accept what is being said.

"But, just like some people are prone to rebellion, so are some fetuses. In that case, the unborn child might want to explore homosexuality just to see what all the fuss is about."

Ritualistic Killings May be Gay Related

CHICAGO — The coroner of a northwest Indiana county, where skeletal remains of four young men were found, said Wednesday that the men may have been the victims of "a homosexual killer" who "ritualistically disposed of the bodies in a barnyard graveyard."

"I think we are dealing with a systematic ritualistic and homosexual type of killing here," said Dr. David S. Dennis, coroner of Newton County, Ind.

Indiana State Police said three of the victims apparently were white; one was black. The head of one of the victims was missing. The trousers of each victim were pulled down around the ankles, "suggesting... homosexual activity," the coroner said.

Mushroom pickers discovered three bodies Tuesday evening on an abandoned farm about 85 miles south of Chicago, off U.S. 41. A fourth body was discovered by police Wednesday morning, about 20 feet away from the others.

The farm, which had been idle for about 2½ years, is near Lake Village, Ind., about 1½ miles south of the Kankakee River.

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


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


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Paradise Cafe

Other touches of the Cafe include quiches, stuffed avacodo, and omelettes,, which remain to be tested.


