## MBA— "Heroes: Coming out in the workplace."

More than 70 people at the MBA's May meeting were inspired by the presentation of "Heroes: Coming out in the workplace."

Seeing the faces filling the room and introducing speakers Judge Rand Hoch, Lucy Ford and Clive Thomas, MBA's Tom Dyer noted what an exciting time it was to be gay and lesbian here. "I just feel we're on the verge of wonderfulness in Central Florida."

Rand Hoch, the only worker's compensation judge for Volusia and Seminole counties, said he "came screaming out of the closet" after moving from Massachusetts in 1978.

Hoch helped to get sexual orientation added to Palm Beach County's housing anti-discrimination ordinance. Once tapped as joining by the governor, Hoch noticed lawyers started pointing out clients were gay, or they tried to bully him around. Some attorneys said they were happy their gay kids had Hoch as a role model.

Lucy Ford, a co-founder of Orlando's chapter of AT&T's LEAGUE and active LCN member, had been married 12 years with a son when she came out. She has made sure to be open and honest

with her child. "For a 13 year old, I think he has a very good grasp of what it's like to be a lesbian," she said.

After her divorce, co-workers expected Ford to find a new man so she made up stories about fake boyfriends. "The worst part was I couldn't remember this boyfriend's name," she said. "So the fake boyfriend and I split up and I haven't heard from him since."

Becoming a LEAGUE spokesperson gave Ford a business reason to come out. She recalled telling one manager: "Gay men and lesbians spend a great deal of time and energy on the job trying to hide their personal lives. I let him know ... he has employees that are not as productive as they could be because the environment is not as comfortable as it could be."

Clive Thomas came out on the radio, earning him a GLCS Spectrum Award. Now happy on 540 AM WGT, Thomas shared the ways he used to skirt questions about whether he was gay.

"...nothing bad happened. It was absolutely the right thing to do." Clive Thomas

"I used smoke and mirrors to put them down, but I didn't feel good that I was being controlled by them. I didn't have the guts to say what I am."

He was fired 28 days after coming out on the air in April 1992, despite high ratings and a wealth of sponsors. Despite all that, Thomas maintains "nothing bad happened. It was absolutely the right thing to do."





## Somebody's Gotta Say It!!!

For the past few years, I have been listening to the Women's Community and our cry for visibility. Consistent with my nature and my own desire for self-discovery, I have been committed to studying this concept for its sociopolitical significance and ramifications; and for the most part, I totally agree that one of the goals of our patriarchal society has been to keep women "in their place" which is under the control and delusion of white male dominance. Yes, on Level One women are victims of a society that puts a premium on being male regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, etc.

However, many gains have been made by the women's movement. Clearly not enough! But enough that it is time to re-evaluate where we really are today. Consciousness raising has brought awareness to many women that we do not have equal status in America much less the rest of the world. My concern is what have we done with that awareness.

I see two outcomes. The first is that some women have used this knowledge and certain sociopolitical gains from the women's movement to enrich their lives on every level-intellectually, emotionally, physically, spiritually and socially. The problem, though, is the second outcome. Many women have used the reality of women's oppression and subsequent invisibility as a reason to emain victims internalizing sexism as if it were an immutable personality trait. Women control 52% of the vote in this country. It

is strategically possible for us to achieve status when we finally really want it.

At the abhorrent risk of sounding like Camille Paglia, women need to stop cloaking themselves in the banner of victimhood and characteristics of marginalization - hopelessness, helplessness, poverty. We need to find the path, whether it is counseling, politics or whatever, that moves us through the process from VICTIM to SURVIVAL to ultimately THRIVAL. SURVIVAL is about personal empowerment. But the key to THRIVAL is economic empowerment. As long as most women barely survive economically, their vote is for sale to whatever patriarchal institution or individual that they are financially dependent on.

Women, we must begin to evaluate our standard of living and rethink the choosing of our careers. As long as we choose caregiving roles, we will be undervalued and

underpaid. Remember, if men are not rushing to do a job then it probably generates a survivalist income. Please do not misinterpret

this message as one that undervalues the important nurturing and caring roles that women play in our society. The point is that many women have spent enormous amounts of energy working to change the system. And that work must continue. But the reality is that in this country money is power, so WOMEN, WE MUST GET OUR SHARE.

Anti Gay Initiatives

On Monday, January 10th, two anti-gay initiatives were filed with the Washington secretary of state, setting off petition drives to get the measures on the November 1994 ballot. One of the two measures, filed by the Citizens Alliance of Washington, targets lesbian and gay parents and their families with unprecedented vigor-prohibiting gays and lesbians from becoming foster parents, adopting children, or gaining child custody in a divorce. This measure also bars "minority status based on homosexuality," prohibits schools form presenting homosexuality as positive behavior and bans same-gender marriage. Sam Woodard, director of the initiative's sponsoring organization, the Citizens Alliance of Washington, said that taking a child from its parents would not traumatize the child. He called any trauma that may result "mushy stuff getting blown out of proportion."



# Is Bisexuality About Choice?

Being a self-proclaimed and Out bi-sexual womyn is about living out the consequences of loving and desiring people of either gender. It is about not limiting my potential to love. It's really all very simple. But, until the recent upsurge of the bisexual movement it was difficult to find anyone (much less a vocal group or community) who openly and proudly acknowledge to identify as either/ or a heterosexual woman or a lesbian.

From a feminist point of view, bisexuality calls into question many fundamental assumptions of sexuality in 20th century culture: the duality of gender, the necessity of either bipolar or unipolar relationships; and, in the lesbian community, the model of bisexuality as a stage of coming out, before finally arriving at a TRUE lesbian sexual orientation.

Bisexual, feminist womyn are challenged.

Bisexuality confuses people. They do not know where to put us. We do not fit neatly into a systematic little box. There is no model. nothing to point to in our common cultural background to explain feelings of lust and/or love with both men and women. What does a young womyn of high school age do when she likes both boys and girls? Who are her role models? Where can she go for support that will not suppress her bisexual identity in favor of a heterosexual or a lesbian one?

I know a womyn who was in a lesbian marriage for seven years. I'll call her Honey. One day Honey admitted to her lover, Joan, that there were some men that she was/ had been attracted to. Joan freaked! My lover desires MEN!!! In Joan's mind Honey had stopped being a lesbian and became heterosexual. After much turmoil, Honey and Joan parted. Honey had not said "I slept with men in the past seven years." What she said is "there are some men I have found sexually attractive in my life time." I am certain that if Honey had said "I had on occasion, found other womyn attractive", it may have been the cause of a disagreement, but it would not have precipitated a break-up. Why does the policy of the times demand that

Honey (or any of us) choose betwee womyn and men as objects of attrac-

Sometimes


another joined me
