THE PARENT PERSPECTIVE

One day a policeman came to her door and took her 10-year-old son away.

"Why are you doing this?" she screamed while she fought him off.

He replied, "It's because we have confirmed reports that you do not like strawberries and that is a felony in this state making you an unfit mother."

"But it's estimated that 10% of the population won't eat strawberries..."

"And we intend to find every one of them and take their children away."

"Why? What does someone's berry preference have to do with their ability to be a good parent?"

"It's just not natural. These children will be confused. They will grow up preferring blueberries or, heaven forbid, raisins."

"That's ridiculous", she replied. "This is not something that can be taught. We are bombarded by the media every day with strawberry this, strawberry that. If a berry preference could be taught, everyone would love strawberries. My child encounters plenty of good strawberry-loving role models at his school and church and among our friends. He understands and accepts that there are people with different berry orientations out there. The only thing that is confusing to him is why so many strawberry lovers hate us.

"Besides," she continued, "if I could teach my son a berry preference, I wouldn't teach him one that would expose him to such ridicule and hatred. No parent wants that for her child. I try to teach my son honesty, tolerance, and acceptance of himself and others."

"That's not my problem, ma'am," he said. "This is the law, we have legal precedent, therefore it must be right."

"The law is wrong. The law has been wrong before. The law used to allow slavery. The law used to forbid women the right to vote. What is important is not the law but what is right. And is not right to take my son away from the only home he has ever known and from the mother who loves him with all her heart."

"I'm only doing my job, ma'am," he said. "Personally, I have nothing against strawberry-haters, but it's none of my business whether or not they lose their children. I'm just doing my job."

She fought and fought to get her son back, but too many strawberry-haters were apathetic and too many strawberry-lovers saw nothing wrong in separating a son from his strawberry-hating mother. Nobody lived happily ever after.





Ft. Lauderdale Abortion Clinic to Close in September

After 17 years Joyce Tarnow's Women's Clinic is being forced to move because of continual violence, harassment and intimidation by anti-choice fanatics.

Joyce Tarnow stands proudly in defense of women and in support of Choice. For her activism she has been targeted by the zealots trying to outlaw abortion. The clinic's windows have been shattered five times, motor oil has been dumped at the entrances, locks have been superglued shut, paint has been splattered on the clinic, nails have blanketed the parking lot, patients have been blocked from entering the clinic, and Joyce has been personally harassed at her home.

NOW, Dr. Ben Graber and Women's Clinic (in Broward County) sued last year for damages under the Federal Racketeering statutes. This valiant and lengthy, expensive effort has been stalled. The Moral Majority's attorneys convinced a judge to release them from the case and forced the plaintiffs to pay the "not-so-Moral and definitely not-the-Majority's" legal fees.

This unexpected expenditure was the final straw, exhausting all remaining cash reserves. Yet, on the heels of this disaster, the landlord has refused to renew her lease because of anti-abortion coercion. Confronted with these multiple catastrophes, Joyce and her staff are faced with closing the clinic.

The Feminist Majority's National Clinic Defense Project has come to help, committing energy, people and financial resources to this project. The goal - Raise the money necessary to relocate Women's Clinic to a better and more secure location.

Here's how I met Katie, love of my life. I was walking in a park in NYC and she was sitting under a tree, vision in a gray suit. I mustered up my nerve and asked her what she was reading. "See for yourself," she said in her sexy Russian accent while holding up the book whose title was in Cyrillic. I switched the conversation to music. Her diamond nosering, her bottomless charcoal grey eyes, the expensive-looking cut of her suit, and I was hooked. (Turns out she was reading a book on lesbian life in the former Soviet Union.)

Keep smiling, keep searching, keep the faith. Remember you gotta love yourself first. If you can't be good company for yourself, certainly you can't be good company for others. 

With the "red menace" gone, rightwing leaders now wage their holy war against women's rights, lesbian and gay rights and affirm the racist attacks by scapegoating the poor. particularly low income women of color. Racial and sexual violence and violence based on sexual orientation have reached alarming proportions in the U.S. and worldwide. White supremacist groups in coalition with the pseudo religious right wing are waging hate campaigns nationwide. Guns have killed more people in this country in a year than died in the Vietnam war. Our elder citizens live in daily fear of being victimized by violence. The violence against women in our homes, the workplace and the street is at an historic,
