#### Gay Nail's Shop Talk

While reading some back issues of "Herizon" (Jacksonville Newsletter), we found some really great articles entitled "Gay Nail's Shop Talk." We have gotten permission to reprint these articles, and we hope that you enjoy them as much as we did! Happy reading:

... Now, let's talk about steel tape rules. Just about everyone owns at least one of these. They come in different sizes and colors, according to the manufacturer and the intended use of the tape. Flexible and retractable, they can measure curved and straight distances.

I personally prefer a Stanley or a Lufkin, and while writing this article, I will be describing the new 12' Lufkin I recently purchased for \$3.88 (reg. \$6.88) at the store named after those cute little dogs, or similar to the drink you mix with water.

This tape is the most practical for general, all purpose use. It's 3/4" wide (a 1/2" tape is less bulky, but cannot span as great a distance without buckling), and painted yellow for easy reading. Inches are painted with black numbers, feet are yellow on a black background, and stud marks are yellow on a red background. Remember, studs are usually 16" on center, as indicated on this tape. However, in newer construction, studs can be 24" on center (on center means the distance between the center of one stud and the center of the next stud).

This tape also has a power return, belt clip, and toggle lock. It's important to note here that you shouldn't just unlock your tape and watch with amazement at how neat it is when the tape flies back into its case. Take it easy!

There's one reason for the silver thing on the end. It's not just to stop the tape from disappearing into its case. Look closely at that silver thing. It has two rivets holding it onto the tape, and should move in and out the distance of its own thickness. This allows you to accurately measure by hooking the blade over and object, or by butting the end up to your beginning point. Don't try to fix this little silver thing like I once did by using a hammer and a pair of pliers to tighten those loose rivets!


