One of Eight

Write down the name of seven women plus yourself. Of these friends, co-workers and family members, one will develop breast cancer sometime in her life. In fact, nationally, one woman is diagnosed every three minutes with breast cancer: 25% of those will die.

Many of us think that breast cancer happens to other people-- that we are not THE one in eight. Here are some risk factors to consider:

▼Of the women diagnosed with breast cancer, 75% have NO risk factors.

▼The greatest risk is being female.

▼Having a mother, sister or grandmother with breast cancer increases risk factors two to three times.

▼If the cancer occurred in mother or sister before menopause or occurred in both breasts, the risk is even higher.

▼Having your first child after age 30 or not having children increases the risk.

▼So does early menstruation (before age 12) or late menopause (after age 55); a history of ovarian or colon cancer; a high fat, low fiber diet; and obesity, particularly after menopause. About 90% of the time, cancer occurs as a hard, stony, singular, non-mobile lump that is anchored in surrounding tissues of the breast. It is usually a painless lump that can be felt, found only in one breast and occurs in women over 35 years old. However, often dangerous breast cancer signs are ignored because they have different characteristics than a lump.

Some common misconceptions about breast cancer are:

▼Women under the age of 35 don't develop breast cancer.

▼Breast cancer is not painful. (Although Fibrocystic breast condition is always painful, 11% of women diagnosed with breast cancer describe pain as a symptom.)

▼Mammography is foolproof. (10% of breast cancers never form a lump that can be felt or seen on mammography.)

Breast self exams should be performed monthly right after your period, when your breasts are not swollen or tender. Mammography is another tool for early detection. It is suggested that you get a baseline mammogram at the age of 35.

STATE & NATIONAL NEWS

In July, a Jacksonville judge ruled that a gay divorced father gave up his rights to share in decisions about his children's upbringing when he moved in with his HIV-positive lover. "To subject the minor children to added conflicts arising from their homosexual father's lifestyle and sexual conduct," wrote Judge A.C. Soud, "is a pound of flesh that this court will not exact from them."

"We're appalled by the judge's decision," said a representative of the American Civil Liberties Union, which immediately contacted the father's lawyer to dicuss an appeal; "To say that gays are incompatible with being good parents is just dead wrong."



A bill providing health insurance benefits to domestic partners of Atlanta city employees passed the City Council on August 2.

Sodomy between consenting adults is now legal in the District of Columbia for the first time because Congress allowed the local law barring it to lapse. A repeal law passed by the DC Council and signed by Mayor Sharon Pratt Kelly in May had been subject to a 60 day review period, during which congress could have overturned the measure. But without a word of debate in the House of the Senate. the review period ended the week of September 17. The repeal ends a 12-year battle by gay rights groups and civil libertarians, who called the law a violation of the constitutional right to privacy.

The State Department has quietly modified its personnel policies to make it clear that gays and lesbians will not be discriminated against in applying for or serving in the Foreign Service.

What Color Is Your Triangle?

As sure as there's a difference between men and women. there's a difference between a pink and a black triangle. One represents gay men, the other lesbians. During World War II, every prisoner in the Nazi German concentration camps wore a uniform which bore a symbol, in the form of a triangle or a variation on one, denoting his or her status. It is common knowledge that Jews wore double triangles, vellow on vellow, forming the Star of David. Less commonly known are the other: red for political prisoners, brown for gypsies, blue for emigrants, green for criminals, dark purple or red with black circle below for Jehovah's Witnesses. The uniforms of male homosexuality bore a pink triangle. Lesbians, although few in number, were identified by a black triangle.

Over the years, the inverted pink triangles has evolved as a symbol in the homosexual community, representing the oppression of gays. Many gay men and women wear to in some form to signify our oneness with those who suffered and died in the concentration camps cause of sexual preference.


Millions of women in Nazi Germany were prosecuted, persecuted, and tortured. Rape and bodily abuse for so-called medical experimentation were commonplace... Even the word "gay" has become synonymous with homosexual men, although it is a derivative from the Greek Earth Goddess, Gaia. I, for one, refuse to relinquish my right to ownership of the term. If gay men want to call themselves "male lesbians," that's fine with me.

Some might say, "Why the fuss? The significance of the pink triangle is in what it represents for all of us, not just gay men." Or, as one woman I know, who calls herself a feminist, said, "It's not our job to educate others about the black triangle."

Maybe it's not your job, but I'm making it mine. Right here, right now. In your face...

..You want it pink? Fine, I want it pink too--on one side, with the other side black. Better yet, let's go with the rainbow triangle, signifying our opposition to all the oppression--gender, radical, ethnic, religious and sexual preference. That's called compromise. Working together toward a common goal. Or, You wear my triangle, I'll wear yours."

families, child rearing, and other issues of significance to lesbian mothers and their families. We create, with referrals from our membership, an extensive directory of supportive resources for lesbian mothers. We maintain a member directory, and organize a "mom to mom" referral program, connecting lesbian mothers dealing with similar issues. We offer our members the choice to participate in media interviews or academic research projects in order to better educate the public about lesbian motherhood. We offer phone consultations, at a sliding scale, for women who desire immediate information about their options in creating a family.

"We've been organizing here in Central Ohio for more than 5 years, and over 100 local women and their children have been participating in Momazon meetings," says Momazon's founder and director, Kelly McCormick, Ph.D. "Momazons is all about lesbians connecting to share our collective wisdom about creating families, mothering, and raising children."

One year memberships to Momazons cost \$15-20 sliding scale, and includes a subscription to the Momazon newsletter. The interactive style of the newsletter encourages a dialogue among lesbian mothers. "Subscribers can join the discussion and become contributors to the newsletter," McCormick states. Individuals contributing \$100 or more become "founding mothers" and lifetime members.

It is our vision that no lesbian interested in children or mothering should have to feel isolated, suffer homophobic reactions in silence, or search in vain for lesbian-family supportive professionals in her quest to create or nurture family.

FIGHT TO PROTECT OUR RIGHTS FROM THE RADICAL RIGHT

The Radical Right seeks to legislate our rights away, in order that gays and lesbians not receive legal protection under the Florida Constitution. This action will take place in November, 1994 when the American Family Association (AFA) will be lying to Florida citizens as to what constitutes a minority and what it is that gays and lesbians of Florida deserve.

The American Family Association and David Caton will teach that gavs and lesbians are child molesters and that we want "special rights." The "special rights" will force employers to hire gays and lesbians. The American Family Association will inform our nature allies (Black, Hispanic and others) that we are trying to equate our struggle to the history of intolerance that have greeted their struggle for inclusion of the "American Dream." This information will be given to our allies through the use of misinformation and out and out lies about what is a minority.

In order to counter these lies by the American Family Association, each of us must be willing to work to preserve our rights. As a method to



alert the citizens of Florida as to the dangers of the Radical Right, The Floridians United Against Discrimination Steering Committee, PAC sponsored a Florida tour of Peggy Norman in November. The Radical Right is having its members run for offices without revealing their true agenda. A member of the Radical Right (Pam Peters) ran for mayor of Winter Park in the November, 1993 elections.

Floridians United Against Discrimination, Steering Committee PAC believes that in order to defeat the AFA, we must coalition build with our natural allies and others who believe that there must be separation of church and state. The local supporting organization who is working to coalition build is Citizens Acting for Rights and Equality (CARE). This organization is different than Central Floridians **United Against Discrimination** (CFUAD) which supports the goals of Floridians United Against Discrimination, a social welfare organization which seeks to run a media campaign.

We must be willing to realize that there is enough work to keep all of us occupied and that we cannot be united by backbiting and spreading untruths. The next meeting of CARE will be held on December 18, 1993 at GLCS, E Colonial Drive, Orlando at 10:00am.

Each of us must be willing to work to preserve our rights from the intolerance of the Radical Right. We must donate funds, educate the straight, gay and lesbian and communities of color as to our needs for inclusion on the American Dream. We must inform our enemies that we will no longer take the scraps that they leave us. In order to fight the radical right we must "come out" in our own way, and let our coworkers, employees, relatives and neighbors know that as gays and lesbians we are not hiding in the shadows. To win this struggle, we must all be willing to donate our time, talents and money. Orlando, Florida. Approximately 100 people attended the October MBA meeting spotlighting **Orlando** Sentinel writers Jav Boyar and Greg Dawson. Boyar, a film critic, and Dawson, a television columnist, described the various responsibilities their jobs entail, and in an entertaining manner discussed the positive changes in portrayals of gays and lesbians in their respective fields. There has been a definite improvement in the roles assigned, as well as the type of emphkasis placed on them, as apparent in the example of characters played by Sandra Bernhard and Morgan Fairchild in the television sitcom "Roseanne". Not only are traditional stereotypes being cast aside, but gay and lesbian characters are not always the particular focus of a film or television program, but often just a simple part of the plot, conveying and acceptance of them as "a part of regular life." Although Dawson felt "And the Band Played On" covered a lot of ground, Boyar disagreed, stating that for such a controversial issue, he "didn't feel emotionally involved". In ansering questions from the floor, both writers expressed their support as well as a genuine pleasure at being asked to address the membership of MBA.


