Small Strides -- The Florida Board of Governor's recently decided to endorse a change to the rules governing attorneys who practice law in the state of Florida. The anti-discrimination rule as proposed and adopted will now read: "A lawyer shall not engage in conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice, including to knowingly, or through callous indifference, disparage, humiliate, or discriminate against litigants, jurors, witnesses, court personnel, or other lawyers on account of race, ethnicity, gender, religion, national origin, disability, marital status, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, or age." Any member found to have violated the rule may earn a disciplinary sanction. The etition for acceptance of the rule

change now goes to the Florida Su-

preme Court for approval.

♦The first case of female-to-female HIV transmission was recorded in 1984. ♦ It is now 1992 and female-to-female HIV transmission remains virtually overlooked and/or ignored. Lesbians still think they are not at risk.

Disease prevention depends upon two things: first, you have to understand how a disease is transmitted, and second, you must learn how to stop its transmission.

The Gay Man's Disease - Over the past few years we have seen an explosion in AIDS coverage and prevention. While medical research, behavioral studies and media attention have been important in fighting this disease, it is sad that this progress has taken place only in recent years. It is also important to note that this attention is directed exclusively at male homosexuals and, more recently, heterosexuals.

In the beginning AIDS was seen as a "Gay Man's Disease;" the medical community and society as a whole seemed content to sit back, ignore, and or condemn persons with AIDS.

At that time, heterosexuals were thought to be "low risk". There was little concern about heterosexual transmission and even less about educating the "straight" community. As a result, heterosexual transmission of HIV is now climbing to epidemic proportions.

A Lesson Poorly Learned - You would think that as a society we would learn from such tragic mistakes. Evidently, we have not. Eight full years have passed since the first reported case of female-to-female HIV

transmission and gay women still have no information about the risk (or prevention) of HIV/AIDS as it relates to their lifestyles.

One spokesperson for the Centers for Disease Control trivialized the lack of information available to gay women about HIV/AIDS by claiming lesbians "don't have much sex."

Lesbians have been misguided and misinformed into believing that they are a low risk because they are lesbians. It is what we do, not who we are, that puts us at risk.

Lesbians at Risk - A lesbian becomes HIV-infected the way any woman can, for example: 6 some lesbians engage in oral sex, vaginal, and or anal intercourse with men by choice, force, or necessity, & some use drugs and share needles, & some have received blood transfusions, some are artificially inseminated, & some exchange blood and vaginal secretions during oral or manual sexual contact with women,* some lesbians share dildos and other sex toys,* & some lesbians who have engaged in none of these activities do have multiple sexual partners and are at risk even if only one to those partners have engaged in one or more of the above activities.

*HIV is in menstrual blood as well as other blood: it is also found in the vaginal fluid and breast milk of infected women.




Dear LCN.





More Openly Gay Women Are Starting Own Business LESBIAN ORIENTED CONCERNS ARE TARGETING AN INCREASINGLY VISIBLE MARKET.

When Lesley Kushner and Deborah Grossberg started their San Francisco clothing business in December, they decided on one unconventional offering - a line of T-shirts emblazoned with lesbian slogans.

"We're tired of being invisible," says Ms. Kushner, a co-owner of Bilcat Co. The T-shirts are catching on. One local retailer alone, Petyr Kane, says he has been selling about two dozen a day to local women and tourists.

These days, many openly lesbian women, such as the two San Franciscans, are rushing to start their own businesses. With a broad array of products and services, they are targeting an increasingly visible market of women like themselves. As in the general market, men have long dominated the gay business community. But women are narrowing the gap.

In Chicago, businesses owned by openly gay women have quintupled to more than 500 in the last five years, says Tracy Baim, who published a guide to local lesbian-owned and gayowned businesses. The enterprises represent a wide range of businesses, including electronics stores, jewelers, florists, general retailers, printers, Tshirt shops, interior designers, event planners and hair salons.

Lesbian Connection, an 18-year-old national magazine favored by older women, credits new lesbian-owned businesses for much of its 52% growth

in advertising in the past five years. The magazine's publisher, a collective in East Lansing, Mich., called Ambitious Amazons, reports that listings for bed and breakfasts and guesthouses its fastest-growing classified advertising category - more than tripled to 72. Display ads for travel cruises and safaris - a category that didn't exist in the magazine five years ago - are plentiful, too.

Judy Dlugacz, owner of Olivia Records, Inc., an Oakland, Calif., producer of women's music, started chartering cruises three years ago. She says her company's revenue has grown to \$4 million annually. A growing array of lesbian publications enables her to advertise widely, she adds. To attract customers she offers videos showing ships packed with women mostly middle-aged - enjoying past

Gay Women Organize Other entrepreneurs also say the lesbian market has become more identifiable and accessible as gay women have formed social, political and business networks, as well as independent publications, in towns across the nation. In San Francisco, for instance, an organization of lesbian professionals and business owners, called Bay Area Career Women, has tripled in membership to 1,500 in nine years. Its newsletter gives advertisers access to the market. Maureen O'Leary, the group's president, says, "Membership


in this organization is growing, so the access to advertising is growing."

In addition, a younger generation of lesbians feel less guarded about their sexuality than their predecessors. "I've never felt bad being a lesbian," says Ms. Bain, the publisher, who is 29. "I know that people 10 to 20 years older than me had to go through a lot before they could come to that point."

Deborah Justice, a young artist in Denver, adds: "A lot of women who work in corporations and the business sector are coming out and feeling freer" about owning lesbian-oriented art. She says she and her companion, also an artist, sell many of their works at women's music festivals.

Many of the new entrepreneurs are middle-aged women who have struck out on their own after leaving failed marriages. Others, including younger women, have bolted from careers stunted by discrimination, which affects many lesbians. In a recent survey of 7,500 lesbians and gay men, 11% of the women and 8% of men say they were denied promotions, harassed or fired in the prior six months, says Jeffrey Vitale, owner of Overlooked Opinions Inc., a Chicago firm which did the survey. Now, these disaffected women find they can make a buck, serving their








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The Parent Perspective

no fuss, no pretense, no nonsense.





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Democrat VS Republican

Democrat-- In a new twist on the concept of "family values" that undoubtedly made Vice President Dan Quayle cringe, Los Angeles resident Bob Hattoy told delegates in a speech he made at the Democratic National Convention in New York City July 14 that "President Bush's family-the American family-has AIDS," and Bush is allowing its members to die by not doing anything about it.

Hattoy, the senior environmental adviser for Gov. Bill Clinton's presidential campaign, was diagnosed with AIDS shortly before Clinton locked up the Democratic presidential nomination June 2 in California. Upon learning of Hattoy's diagnosis, Clinton personally asked him to address the convention as a person with AIDS.

"When he heard that I had been diagnosed, Bill called me three times at home to see how I was doing," says Hattoy, who has become friends with Clinton and his wife, Hillary, during the campaign. "I went to see him when he was in Los Angeles, and we got all weepy together. During a limo ride to his MTV taping, we talked about how insane America is, how people can't deal with AIDS, and what could be done. I told him I just didn't want to be treated as dead-by Bill Clinton or by anyone else." from The Advocate, August 1992

Republican Tyler Franz, an openly gay man who worked in the Bush-Quayle re-election campaign headquarters, filed a complaint July 21 with the District of Columbia Human Rights Commission against the campaign for discrimination based on sexual orientation. Franz, who held a job in the campaign's information center, was demoted and transferred to an unoccupied area in the campaign in early July. According to Franz, s personnel director said the demotion was due to "ideological differences with the religious Right," a comment that Franz believes refers to his being openly gay. Following the demotion, Franz resigned.

Since filing his complaint, Franz has been the center of media attention focused on the debate within the Republican party between moderates and far Right Christians.
