

The tempest starts as juvenile passion erupts on the lawn and has its way with two teen girls in the throws of first love. They are interrupted by a sister, who promptly becomes hysterical, and the chaotic damage starts.

A Stone Gone Mad is history in living color. Young ones, if you are at all curious about "how it was" in years (only recently) gone by...here it is. Jacquelyn Park's sometimes fine and sometimes poetic writing yanks you from page to page. I've decided that instead of spending my money on an Alix Dobkin concert and be subjected to a message I oppose, I'll make a contribution to Spouse Abuse.

Continued from p. 7 will become the highest ranking acknowledged gay or lesbian person ever to serve in the U.S. government.

Three high school teachers in Meridian, Idaho, were suspended because they had invited several lesbian mothers to come in and speak to their classes as part of a project on parenting. The teachers were suspended on November 15 only hours after the speakers had finished. They were also ordered to apologize to the students and parents, and letters of reprimand were placed in their files.

On November 16, about 500 students staged a lunchtime rally in support of the teachers. Within two weeks, the school board reversed its decision-the teachers were reinstated without any reprimand and the board said it would establish a clear policy on future guest speakers.

The week of President Clinton's inauguration brought

many firsts to the gay and lesbian community, which together added up to a sense of inclusion and participation that gays and lesbians have never before experienced in any administration: Triangle Ball-The first lesbian/gay inaugural ball. Lesbian & Gay Bands of America-the first gay-identified group to march in an inaugural parade. Barely 10 minutes into his inaugural speech, Clinton

became the first American president to speak of AIDS: "the

world AIDS crisis..affect(s) us all." Author-poet Maya

Angelou, the first African-American and the first woman to deliver a presidential poem, became the first perso to note the existence of gays during al. official inaugural ceremony. An openly gay couple, Dennis Layton and Joshua Rodin, were seen on C-SPAN and CNN News by millions getting a presiden-

tial greeting. After shaking hands with Clinton, Dennis turned to Joshua and introduced him to the president as "my husband." Dennis later said Clinton "didn't blink an eyelash. He was hip." Colonel Margaret Cammer-

out, received an invitation from Clinton to attend the Inaugural Ball.


holds barred stand up routine about


