Colonial Williamsburg is setting the pace for United Way five years running!

For the fifth consecutive year, Colonial Williamsburg has been selected as a pacesetter for the Greater Williamsburg United Way fund-raising campaign.

This year's theme, "80/80 in 1988", also describes our goal: 80% of all employees participating in the campaign contributing a total of \$80,000. The monetary goal is a 4% increase over last year's final campaign total.

The campaign will start on August 8. Everyone is encouraged to return their donation cards early to be eligible for the incentive prize drawings. There will be great prizes this year such as a pewter tea service from Kirk Steiff, free passes to the Williamsburg Theater, tin gaoler's lanterns, a framed print of Sweet William, and a 35mm camera from Kodak, just to name a few.

The grand prize, to be awarded September 7, is a weekend for two at a resort hotel plus \$250. Our first prize drawing will take place on August 16 at the Paint Shop at 3 p.m.

Dr. Honablue to talk about sickle cell anemia

Dr. Richard Honablue will be at the Cascades on Wednesday, August 17, at 2:30 p.m. to talk to retirees, employees, and their dependents about sickle cell anemia.

Also, two technicians from the Sickle Cell Anemia Association of the Peninsula will be available before and after his presentation (from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. and from 4 p.m. to 5 p.m.) to take blood for testing. The association will contact employees with the results. There is no charge for this screening.

Sandra Day O'Connor is named to become a trustee of Colonial Williamsburg

Sandra Day O'Connor, associate justice of the United States Supreme Court, has accepted an invitation to join the board of trustees for CW. She will be formally elected to the position at

the bi-annual board meeting next November.

Justice O'Connor is currently a member of the National Board of the Smithsonian Associates. Until 1981, she was on the board and had served as president of the Heard Museum in Phoenix, Arizona.

Justice O'Connor was nominated to the Supreme Court by President Reagan in 1981, becoming the first woman on America's highest court. Previously, she was an Arizona Court of Appeals judge and a superior court judge in Phoenix.

A native of El Paso, TX, she was graduated from Stanford University, magna cum laude, and from its law school.

Are you lost in the mail?
