"Our success in the last decade is attributable directly to you and all of our employees," said Charles Longsworth, president, at a recent meeting with administrative officers and directors. "Change and growth such as we have seen is not easy to achieve or accommodate, and I am very proud of the way all our employees have responded to change."

"We need to examine the various parts of our organization to make sure they are appropriately sized, organized, and staffed for the work we need to get done, therefore, we are undertaking a study of the location, cost, organization, and staffing of all our functional activities and the responsibilities of each of us in management," he added.

Colonial Williamsburg has engaged Joseph Jackson, president of Security Pacific Organization Consultants, Incorporated, to assist in the study. During the week of February 8, Joe Jackson, along with his colleague, Richard Detoy, will hold meetings with small groups of managers and supervisors to learn more about us and our work. Results of the study are expected sometime in early May.

"I emphasize that the primary purpose is to help us develop the best possible organization to do our work in preservation, history education, service and hospitality, and meeting our own and visitors' and guests' high expectations," concluded Mr. Longsworth.

1988 Compensation Guidelines Announced

Although the Federal minimum wage remains \$3.35, the Foundation has increased the entire rate/range structure for non-bargaining unit jobs by 3%. This means that both ends of salary ranges-beginnings and tops--have gone up.

Salaries of employees earning less than the 1988 beginnings of grades were increased to those rates starting January 3. On individual merit review dates these employees will receive the full amount of recommended merit increase.

Merit increase guidelines for nonbargaining unit employees are:

Outstanding: 6-5% Very Good: 4-3% Good: 2%

Fair/Unsatisfactory: 0% With administrative officer approval those employees performing exceptionally may receive increases beyond the 6% limit.

Promotional increases continue to range from 2% to 12% with increases of 6% or more establishing new merit review dates.
