Annenberg Foundation Gives \$5 Million for Educational Endowment and Facilities

The Annenberg Foundation, a charitable organization created by former diplomat and publisher, Walter H. Annenberg, and his wife Leonore, has given an unrestricted \$5 million to the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation. The gift will be used for the improvement and support of Colonial Williamsburg's educational, research, conservation, and library activities and facilities.

Changes in Colonial Williamsburg's educational facilities are in the earliest planning stage and no details of design, location, or timetable are settled. Such facilities could house the Foundation's staff of historians, archaeologists, curators, and educators in offices near a central research library. Some of the educational facilities and services may be available to visitors and those scholars seeking additional information on specific subjects.

The Annenbergs are longtime supporters of Colonial Williamsburg who have made substantial gifts to the Foundation since 1977. In 1983 they gave \$1 million toward the renovation of the Visitor Center.

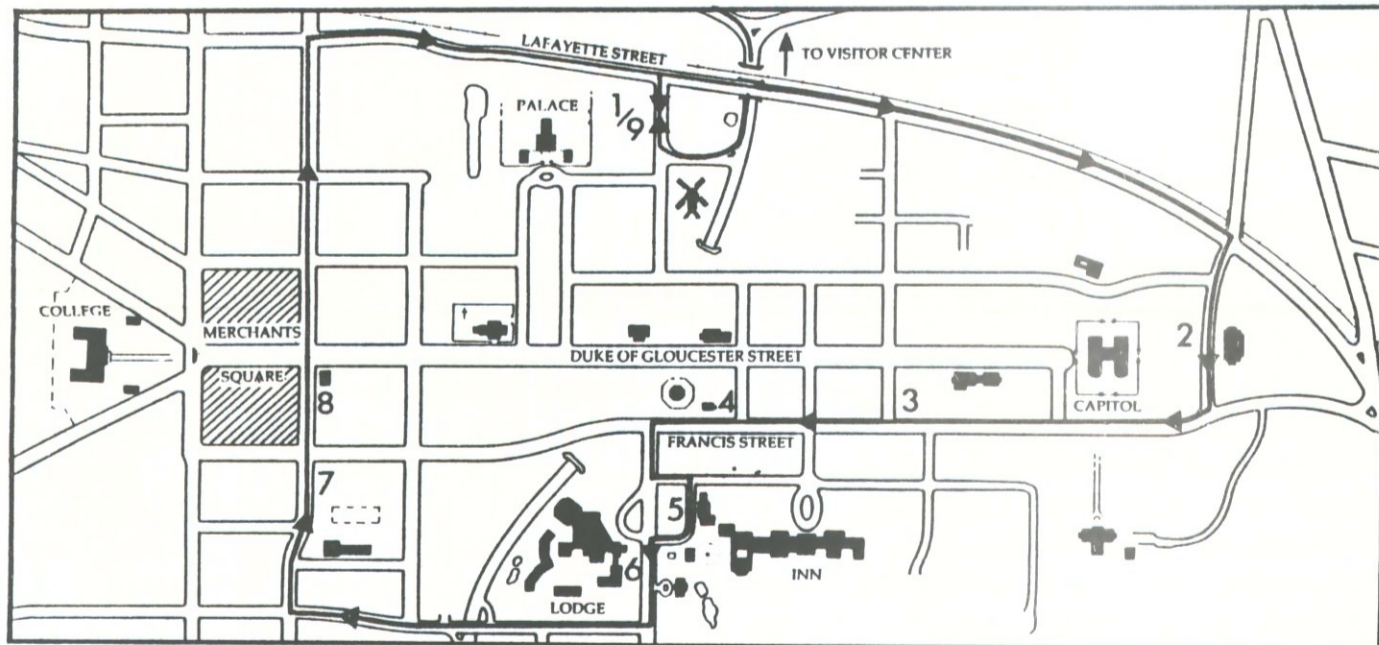
Bus Route Begins July 17; 20th-Century Intrusion Removed

On July 17, with the completion of the new bus turnaround at the Palace parking lot, our new bus route will be launched. The new route circles the Historic Area, with stops at strategic locations designed to give visitors easy access to all parts of the Historic Area (see map below).

According to Dennis O'Toole, vice president and project manager, the intent of the new bus route is to eliminate bus traffic from a major portion of the Historic Area. "The buses have long been a concern to us in that they distract from the 18th-century atmosphere we wish to achieve in the Historic Area," Denny explained. "One of the biggest challenges was in developing a new route that would continue to provide good service for our visitors, while meeting the needs of our bus drivers and the city."

We recognize that the project has resulted in some inconvenience for visitors and employees--especially those who park at the Palace parking lot. We expect that there will be some confusion for awhile, as people get used to the new route and stops. We thank everyone for their patience, now and in the future, as they deal with the change.

The most important thing is that we have improved the atmosphere of the Historic Area and, as a result, have improved the educational experience for our visitors."



Reduced-price mammograms available in July and August

A mammogram is a special low-dose x-ray which produces a sharp, detailed picture that can usually reveal breast cancer before it's detected by physical examination. The American Cancer Society recommends that every woman have a screening mammogram at least once after age 35, every one to two years between the ages of 40 and 50, and annually after age 50.

The Chesapeake Mobile Imaging Service is providing mammograms for \$40 and the Williamsburg Community Hospital is offering them for \$50. Most insurance carriers do not reimburse for screening mammograms. If your doctor recommends a mammogram due to a symptom or high risk status, ask for a referral -- this may influence your insurance carrier's reimbursement decision.
